A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the current Electoral College system as the best way to elect the President of

2 the United States; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the Founding Fathers rejected having the President of the United States be

4 elected by a national popular vote and instead chose the Electoral College system; and

5 WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system encourages presidential candidates to 6 campaign in large metropolitan areas as well as in rural areas and small states; and

7 WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system ensures that the winning presidential8 candidate has support from multiple regions of the country; and

9 WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system respects the Founding Fathers' strong
10 belief that individual states should have a vital role in electing the President of the United
11 States; and

WHEREAS, the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact diminishes the importance ofindividual states in presidential elections; and

14 WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system respects the separation and balance of

15 power and authority between the state governments and the federal government; and

16 WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system ensures that Georgia's electoral votes are

17 awarded based on how the majority of the state's electors voted; and

WHEREAS, under the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact, Georgia's electoral votes
may be awarded to a candidate for whom the majority of the state's electors did not vote; and

WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system is better suited to address recounts because they occur at the state level and are thus more manageable than if recounts were to occur at the national level as may be the case pursuant to the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact, if adopted; and

WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system creates a necessary balance betweenagrarian and industrial interests; and

WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system best preserves our two-party system andprevents the fracture of the nation's political structure; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has rejected over 1,000 amendments to the United
States Constitution to change the Electoral College system, including amendments to
implement a popular vote system; and

WHEREAS, the legality of the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact is questionable
because Article I, Section X of the United States Constitution sets forth that no state, without

- 33 the consent of the United States Congress, may "enter into any Agreement or Compact with
- 34 another State."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
 recognize the current Electoral College system as the best way to elect the President of the

37 United States.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State of Georgia shall defeat any legislation that
creates a multi-state compact for the purpose of dismantling the current Electoral College
system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
press.
