## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 7, 2019, as Dahlonega-Lumpkin County Day at the state capitol; and
- 2 for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Lumpkin County, Georgia, was once part of the Cherokee Nation; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Lumpkin County was founded in 1832 by breaking away from Cherokee,
- 5 Habersham, and Hall counties and was named for Wilson Lumpkin, a former governor of the
- 6 State of Georgia; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Lumpkin covers 284 square miles and has a population of more than 30,000;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Lumpkin County has great natural beauty, including dozens of rivers, streams,
- 10 creeks, and cascading waterfalls, as well as hundreds of miles of hiking trails; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Lumpkin County is known as the gateway to the North Georgia mountains and
- 12 is home to many outdoor tourist attractions, such as the Chattahoochee National Forest,
- 13 through which the Appalachian Trail runs; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Dahlonega, in Lumpkin County, is the closest town to the southern terminus of
- 15 the Appalachian Trail; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Lumpkin County and Dahlonega are home to many tourist attractions, including
- 17 the Dahlonega Gold Museum, the oldest courthouse building still standing in Georgia, which
- 18 underwent a major renovation in 2018; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the Gold Museum and the Consolidated and Crisson gold mines all
- 20 experientially tell the story of Dahlonega and Lumpkin County as the site of America's first
- 21 major gold rush; and

WHEREAS, Dahlonega and Lumpkin County's gold mines were the source of the gold that

- 23 covers both the Capitol dome in Atlanta and Price Memorial Hall on the University of North
- 24 Georgia's Dahlonega campus; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Dahlonega and Lumpkin County are home to Camp Merrill, one of only three
- 26 U.S. Army Ranger camps, which was named for Brigadier General Frank D. Merrill and was
- 27 founded in 1952; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the University of North Georgia, a supportive contributor to the Dahlonega and
- 29 Lumpkin County community, is one of only six senior military colleges in the United States
- and is home to the Boar's Head Brigade; and
- 31 WHEREAS, Lumpkin County and Dahlonega are the Heart of Georgia Wine Country, with
- 32 six wineries and nine wine tasting rooms; and
- 33 WHEREAS, Dahlonega has been designated as the Official Wine Tasting Room Capital of
- 34 Georgia; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Dahlonega and Lumpkin County are home to a new Zac Brown distillery that
- 36 produces high-quality spirits and Etowah Meadery which offers wine made from honey; and
- 37 WHEREAS, Downtown Dahlonega was the national winner of the Great American Main
- 38 Street Award in 2016; and
- 39 WHEREAS, the Dahlonega-Lumpkin County Chamber and Visitors Bureau and its
- 40 community partners, including the Dahlonega Downtown Development Authority, the
- 41 Lumpkin County Economic Development Department, the City of Dahlonega, Lumpkin
- 42 County, the University of North Georgia, and Lumpkin County Schools, are working to
- 43 develop and implement a vision for the future of the community; and
- 44 WHEREAS, the Dahlonega-Lumpkin County Visitors Center welcomes nearly 200,000
- visitors every year, more than any other Visitors Information Center in the state, except for
- 46 Savannah; and
- 47 WHEREAS, the citizens of Lumpkin County are justly proud of their community, its past,
- 48 and its many contributions to the state, and it is only fitting and proper to recognize this
- 49 amazing county.
