BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

7 Article III, Section IV of the Constitution is amended by revising Paragraph I as follows:

"Paragraph I. *Meeting, time limit, and adjournment*. (a) The Senate and House of Representatives shall organize each odd-numbered year and shall be a different General Assembly for each two-year period. The General Assembly shall meet in a regular <u>budget</u> session on the second Monday in January of each year, or otherwise as provided by law, and may continue in <u>such budget</u> session for a period of no longer than <u>40</u> <u>20</u> days in the aggregate each year. <u>The General Assembly shall be limited to the consideration and</u>

appropriations bill for the current fiscal year. After the conclusion of the regular budget session, the General Assembly shall on a date fixed by concurrent resolution of each house

passage of the general appropriations bill for the next fiscal year and the supplemental

of the General Assembly at the end of the regular budget session, but not sooner than 30

days following the end of the regular budget session, meet in a regular general session and

may continue in such general session for a period of no longer than 20 days in the

aggregate each year. The General Assembly shall be authorized to consider any general

bills and local bills during the regular general session but shall not be authorized to

consider the general appropriations bill or the supplemental appropriations bill during the

regular general session. Local and special legislation may be considered by the General

Assembly at both sessions. By concurrent resolution, the General Assembly may adjourn

any regular <u>budget or general</u> session to such later date as it may fix for reconvening;

provided, however, that the regular budget session must be complete before the regular

general session may begin. Separate periods of adjournment may be fixed by one or more such concurrent resolutions.

- (b) Neither house shall adjourn during a regular <u>budget or regular general</u> session for more than three days or meet in any place other than the state capitol without the consent of the other. Following the fifth day of a special session, either house may adjourn not more than twice for a period not to exceed seven days for each such adjournment. In the event either house, after the <u>thirtieth fifteenth</u> day of any session, adopts a resolution to adjourn for a specified period of time and such resolution and any amendments thereto are not adopted by both houses by the end of the legislative day on which adjournment was called for in such resolution, the Governor may adjourn both houses for a period of time not to exceed ten days.
- (c) If an impeachment trial is pending at the end of any <u>regular general</u> session, the House shall adjourn and the Senate shall remain in session until such trial is completed."

- 47 All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes."
- 48 All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If
- 49 such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall
- 50 become a part of the Constitution of this state.
