A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Grady Memorial Hospital and Grady Health System on the occasion of its
- 2 125th anniversary; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Grady Health System was the vision of Henry W. Grady, editor of the Atlanta
- 4 Constitution, who worried about the lack of quality health care for Atlanta's poor, and on
- 5 June 1, 1892, his extraordinary dream came true when the doors to Grady Hospital were
- 6 officially opened with 110 beds and one operating room with an amphitheater for students
- 7 and staff; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Grady Health System has grown considerably from its original facility and now
- 9 stands as one of the largest public health systems in the United States and the largest hospital
- 10 in Georgia; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Grady Health System maintains its strong commitment to the health care needs
- of the underserved while offering a full range of specialized medical services for the entire
- 13 community; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Grady is recognized worldwide for its leadership in trauma care as the premier
- 15 Level 1 trauma center in Atlanta and for stroke interventions and care that are setting
- 16 standards across the industry; and
- 17 WHEREAS, in 1915, Emory University School of Medicine began training doctors at Grady
- and offering exemplary care to the growing number of patients at the hospital; and
- 19 WHEREAS, in 1978, a medical school was established at Morehouse College and began also
- assuming responsibility for patient care, medical education, and clinical research at Grady;

22 WHEREAS, in partnership with the Emory and Morehouse schools of medicine, its

- 23 paramedic/EMT schools, radiology schools, and former nursing schools, Grady has trained
- 24 many medical professionals working in Georgia, including approximately 25 percent of the
- 25 state's physicians working today; and
- 26 WHEREAS, at any given time, more than 400 clinical trials may be underway at Grady,
- 27 making it one of the nation's most robust medical research programs; and
- 28 WHEREAS, throughout its 125 year history, Grady has been the home to many medical
- 29 "firsts" including: in the 1920s, the first open heart surgery in Georgia and the world's first
- and largest comprehensive cancer center; in the 1970s, the Georgia Poison Center opened at
- 31 Grady; in the 1980s, the world's first 24 hour comprehensive Sickle Cell Center was created
- 32 at Grady; and in the 1990s, Grady revolutionized HIV/AIDS care by opening the Ponce
- 33 Center Infectious Disease Program; and
- 34 WHEREAS, Grady is home to one of only two verified burn centers in the state and Grady
- 35 EMS operates 911 for the City of Atlanta and for six rural Georgia counties as the largest
- 36 hospital based EMS in the state; and
- 37 WHEREAS, in January 2008, a coalition of state and community leaders agreed to create the
- 38 Grady Memorial Hospital Corporation, a nonprofit corporation charged with administering
- 39 the hospital, and members of a new board were announced; and
- 40 WHEREAS, in response to the board's fundraising campaign, more than \$350 million in
- 41 philanthropic donations helped "Save Grady"; and
- 42 WHEREAS, managing over 630,000 patient visits each year, in 2016, Grady Health System
- 43 provided more than \$270 million in indigent and charity care; and
- 44 WHEREAS, Grady continually reaches out to the community, emphasizing wellness,
- 45 prevention, and early detection; and
- 46 WHEREAS, with six neighborhood clinics in Fulton and DeKalb counties offering specialty
- 47 care in the communities, Grady also offers free health screenings, seminars, community fairs,
- 48 and educational conferences throughout the year.
