A RESOLUTION

- 1 Requesting that the State Department of Economic Development cooperate with Queen
- 2 Blessing Itua, Global Empowerment Movement (GEM); and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Senator Donzella James sponsored Senate Resolution 2017 to name Queen
- 4 Blessing Itua, International Chief Adviser as the Lead Coordinator of African Diaspora Day
- 5 (ADD) at the Georgia State Capitol; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Queen Blessing Itua coordinated the African Diaspora Day on March 22, 2016,
- 7 and 14 African Countries, including Haiti (Cameroon, Congo, Ethiopia, Cote d'Ivoire,
- 8 Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda,
- 9 Zambia, and Haiti) participated last year in 2016; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Queen Blessing Itua intends to coordinate the African Diaspora Day annually
- at the Georgia State Capitol, and these countries and many other African Countries and Black
- 12 Communities are expected to participate in the African Diaspora Day at the Georgia State
- 13 Capitol annually; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the mission of African Diaspora Day at the Capitol is to promote a good
- 15 relationship for mutual interest and to urge the Department of Economic Development to
- 16 promote and strengthen mutually beneficial ties with nations of Africa; and
- 17 WHEREAS, it is in the economic interest of this state to promote and strengthen mutually
- 18 beneficial ties with African Diaspora and nations of Africa; and
- 19 WHEREAS, African Diaspora Day promotes the State of Georgia and the Atlanta area as the
- 20 gateway for business with Africa and the port of Savannah as the main center for cargo
- 21 shipment of goods between Africa and the United States; and

22 WHEREAS, continuous development of international partnerships is encouraged to support

- 23 the emergence of Africa's private sector, promote direct foreign investment in Africa, and
- 24 leverage the imbalances in Africa's growing economy, develop a partnership with historically
- 25 black colleges and to promote the relationship with Africa Consulate Generals in Atlanta,
- 26 Georgia; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Queen Blessing Itua launches The Blessings of Africa: We Are the Pride of
- 28 Africa, Enriching and Impacting the Motherland book, Blessings of Africa Empowerment
- 29 Foundation Global Empowerment Movement (GEM) Corporation on March 10, 2017, as
- 30 the platform to facilitate the annual African Diaspora Day at the Georgia State Capitol; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the Blessings of Africa Empowerment Foundation is an African organization
- 32 of GEM dedicated to:
- 33 (1) Bridging the gap between descendants of Africans and to foster personal,
- professional, and socioeconomic growth of Africans in the Diaspora and in the
- 35 motherland as well as in Haiti, Jamaica, the Bahamas, and other Afro Caribbean, Afro
- Latino, and black communities worldwide;
- 37 (2) Providing the platform for Africans to come together, unite, and step up into
- 38 leadership roles, beyond showcasing the rich heritage and culture of the African Diaspora
- via displays of African Music, Arts, Food, Films, Fashion, etc.;
- 40 (3) Promoting business forums and related networking, job creation, investment
- 41 opportunities, cultural diversity, tourism, and food; and
- 42 (4) Empowering the underprivileged, impoverished, voiceless, vulnerable African People
- In Need (APIN), with a focus on impoverished, economically disadvantaged, abused, and
- 44 abandoned Single Mothers and Children In Distress (SMACID) in our communities as
- 45 well as foster the well-being of families, disenfranchised vulnerable women and children
- plagued by the crimes of forced prostitution, human-spousal trafficking, and domestic
- 47 spousal abuse.
- 48 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 49 request the State Department of Economic Development, to whatever extent authorized by
- 50 law and subject to available funds, to:
- 51 (1) Work in collaboration with Queen Blessing Itua, Global Empowerment Movement
- 52 (GEM), and Blessings of Africa Empowerment Foundation to support, promote,
- encourage, and facilitate the establishment of the Global Empowerment Movement center
- 54 (GEM center) African Empowerment Foundation aimed at Self-Economic
- 55 Empowerment (SEE) Life Skills empowerment for poverty prevention and intervention,

using her "Unlocking the Blessing Code" series to achieving greater wellness, and

- 59 (2) Promote the education and enrichment of African business and professional leaders
- training of different professionals and other health care professionals;
- 61 (3) Provide business leaders modern technology in diverse areas: agriculture, health care,
- and facilities in Africa and Georgia;
- 63 (4) Facilitate capacity development to train and enrich African legislators and members
- of parliament about the policy making process in Africa and America; and
- 65 (5) Facilitate capacity development to train and enrich African skill discovery,
- development, and deployment as well as women empowerment and youth enrichment.
