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Senate Resolution 418

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Access to Podiatrists and Limb Saving Services;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, there is an epidemic of patients developing lower extremity complications due
- 4 to poor circulation, diabetes, and other conditions that result in amputations; and
- 5 WHEREAS, in 2019, an estimated 7,000 lower extremity amputations were performed in
- 6 Georgia on patients who had peripheral artery disease (PAD); and
- 7 WHEREAS, evidence shows that when podiatrists are part of administering medical and
- 8 surgical care of the lower extremities, outcomes are better, hospitalizations are fewer and
- 9 shorter, and the healthcare system saves billions of dollars annually; and
- 10 WHEREAS, podiatrists are the first and last line of defense and advocacy for limb salvage,
- 11 but are too often not included in the assessment and evaluation of patients before amputation;
- 12 and

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13 WHEREAS, patients at risk of amputation could benefit greatly from access to podiatrists

- 14 that can coordinate with emergency medical physicians, vascular and general surgeons,
- 15 cardiologists, and other medical professionals to prevent amputations; and
- 16 WHEREAS, study is needed to determine how access to podiatry services among those at
- 17 risk of amputation can be improved, and how testing, screening, and other preventative
- 18 measures, as well as programs to educate and raise awareness of the risks of amputation, can
- 19 be developed and implemented to save the limbs of Georgians with PAD and other
- 20 conditions that increase the risk of amputation.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

- 22 (1) Creation of Senate study committee. There is created the Senate Study Committee
- on Access to Podiatrists and Limb Saving Services.
- 24 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- 25 Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The President shall designate one
- such member as chairperson of the committee.
- 27 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- 29 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 30 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 32 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 34 (5) **Allowances and funding.** The legislative members of the committee shall receive
- 35 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- 37 member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.

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Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the Senate.

40 (6) **Report.**

- 41 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
 42 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
 43 same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
 44 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 48 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 49 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee. 50 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 51 the Secretary of the Senate. Any member of the committee may file a minority report
- that shall accompany the majority report.
- 53 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary of the Senate copies of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 55 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2023.
