7 600 State and National Championships in the past 28 years, including the Georgia
8 Outstanding Award in 2015 and has been awarded the Georgia Outstanding Chapter Award
9 23 times; and

10 WHEREAS, Franklin County Middle School Technology Student Association received the
11 National Chapter of Excellence award in 1993, 1994, 1995, 1999, and 2009; and

12 WHEREAS, past members of the association have gone on to influence the world in
13 education, medicine, aerospace engineering, mechanical engineering, construction
14 management, law, risk management, computer science, agricultural science, agricultural
15 business, computer engineering, material science, network management, and in many
16 traditional vocational areas; and

17 WHEREAS, Franklin County Middle School Technology Student Association had two
18 members from its chapter elected State President of the Georgia Technology Student
19 Association; and

20 WHEREAS, Franklin County Middle School Technology Student Association Advisor, Dr.
21 David Phillips, has received the Tommy Pitchford Inspirational Teacher Award on five
22 separate occasions and was recognized as the Advisor of the Year by the National
23 Technology Student Association in 1994.
