- 46 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ENACTED that State Route 46 from Highway 301
- 47 South to State Route 67 South in Bulloch County is dedicated as the E. Raybon Anderson
- 48 Highway.
- 49 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
- 50 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the road facilities named in this
- 51 resolution.
- 52 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 53 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the Department of
- 54 Transportation and to the families of Deputy Marshall Samual Ervin, Jr., and E. Raybon
