## A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring heroine Joyce Harvin-Banks in service to her country as a member of the United

- 2 States armed forces; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Joyce Harvin-Banks was trained as a communications specialist and served 23
- 4 years in the United States Army, both Active and Reserve; and
- 5 WHEREAS, her numerous military occupational specialties included field artillery target
- 6 acquisition specialist and radio teletype operator, and later as a sergeant, she served as a
- 7 dental assistant specialist during Operation Iraqi Freedom/Operation Enduring Freedom; and
- 8 WHEREAS, she also served 20 years with the New York City Police Department as a police
- 9 officer for six years and then as a detective, working with women experiencing domestic
- 10 violence and with at-risk juveniles until she retired in April, 2012; and
- 11 WHEREAS, those who give positive definition to the profile and disposition of the American
- 12 armed forces profoundly strengthen our shared commitment to the exercise of freedom; and
- 13 WHEREAS, attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its long-standing traditions,
- 14 this legislative body is justly proud to honor all women who served their country as members
- 15 of the United States armed forces; and
- 16 WHEREAS, sixty-one years ago, on June 12, 1948, President Harry S. Truman signed into
- 17 law the Women's Armed Services Act of 1948 (P.L. 625, 80th Congress); this law ensured
- 18 that women would have a permanent place in the Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps;
- 19 and
- 20 WHEREAS, the late Senator Margaret Chase Smith from Maine authored the legislation that
- 21 President Truman signed; the act remains the most significant legislation pertaining to

22 women's military service and is the cornerstone for policies and regulations affecting women;

- 23 and
- 24 WHEREAS, for decades, women veterans served their country with honor and valor and
- 25 excelled in all levels of the military through their demonstrated military capabilities; their
- 26 distinguished role in the defense of our country is recognized and commended; and
- 27 WHEREAS, women from Georgia who have served in the armed forces of the United States
- 28 have made countless contributions and tremendous sacrifices during times of war; and
- 29 WHEREAS, it is important to recognize the contributions of women veterans and educate
- 30 the people of Georgia concerning the role of women during wartime since this nation was
- 31 founded; and
- 32 WHEREAS, women veterans demonstrate their professionalism, dedication, and skills, as
- 33 well as their patriotism and love for their country and the liberties, freedoms, and rights for
- 34 which it stands; and
- 35 WHEREAS, all Americans owe a debt of gratitude to women veterans such as Joyce
- 36 Harvin-Banks, wife and mother of three, who risk their lives in the defense of freedom; and
- 37 WHEREAS, it is the custom of this legislative body to pay tribute to the bravery, patriotism,
- and sacrifice made by women veterans, both those still living and those who have died in
- 39 service to our great country.
- 40 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that members of this body
- 41 pause in its deliberations to honor heroine Joyce Harvin-Banks and all women who served
- 42 their country as members of the United States armed forces.
- 43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 44 to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to Joyce
