## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Jama Hedgecoth; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
- 3 with the passing of Jama Hedgecoth on November 20, 2023; and
- 4 WHEREAS, on February 13, 1958, the world welcomed a force of compassion and change.
- 5 Jama Hedgecoth, a beacon of love and a fervent advocate for both humans and animals, left
- 6 an indelible mark on the world during her journey through life; and
- 7 WHEREAS, she spent most of her childhood driving around the country with her
- 8 evangelistic parents and three siblings, sharing the gospel at various churches and tent
- 9 revivals. It was clear she was an avid animal lover from a very early age as she would
- 10 eagerly ask her parents to visit the zoo every time they pulled into a new town. The answer
- was always the same: no, they couldn't afford it; and
- 12 WHEREAS, she saw many animals in need, from sickly stray pets abandoned in city parking
- lots to injured, orphaned wildlife on the sides of country roads. Determined to help them,
- 14 Jama began sneaking creatures of all types into the family's motel rooms where she would
- 15 tend to their wounds and nurture them back to health. This habit wasn't appreciated by her

16 family, who were frequently kicked out of their motel room and forced to sleep in the car

- 17 when management would discover Jama's uninvited guests crawling and climbing around the
- 18 motel room; and
- 19 WHEREAS, when her parents finally became fed up and demanded that their youngest
- 20 daughter stop taking in animals, Jama boldly told them that one day she would have her own
- 21 place where she could take in any animal that needed her help and that she would let people
- 22 come visit those animals for free so everyone could enjoy them even if they had no money;
- 23 and
- 24 WHEREAS, she founded an animal sanctuary named Noah's Ark in Ellenwood in 1978. The
- 25 sanctuary was so named because it was a vessel of safety for children and animals against
- 26 today's floods of abuse and neglect; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Jama and her young family soon outgrew their original location and moved
- Noah's Ark to its current 250 acre site in Locust Grove in 1990, providing care to animals
- 29 of all types and joy to its many visitors; and
- 30 WHEREAS, in 1990 Noah's Ark became a fully licensed nonprofit organization that would
- 31 go on to become one of the country's largest and most well-respected animal sanctuaries
- 32 based on the outstanding care the Hedgecoth Family provided to their rescued animal
- 33 residents. At the same time, Noah's Ark Children's Care Home continued to grow in size and
- 34 complexity, accepting more and more challenging children and providing refuge to over 400
- 35 foster children by the time the group home closed years later; and
- 36 WHEREAS, Noah's Ark Animal Sanctuary continued to improve and expand until it reached
- 37 international fame when a young bear, lion, and tiger were rescued from a criminal's

basement in Atlanta, Georgia, and placed in the Hedgecoth family's care in 2001. Nicknamed
"BLT" for bear-lion-tiger, Baloo the bear, Leo the lion, and Shere Khan the tiger eventually
healed from their injuries and from the trauma of their abusive past. Bonded through the
suffering they endured early in life and not seeing one another as anything but a sibling, as
"The BLT" lived peacefully together for the rest of their lives while garnering supporters

43 from around the world; and

44 WHEREAS, Baloo, Leo and Shere Khan went on to live out the rest of their lives with dignity and peace in a beautiful natural habitat built for them at Noah's Ark where at no 45 46 charge guests could observe and learn about the unlikely trio of brothers and apply that 47 knowledge to their own lives: If a bear, a lion, and a tiger can live together in harmony without harming one another, surely humans can do better than what we have. Thousands 48 49 of other animals, and even people, share a story like that of the BLT: they were once lost or 50 broken but after finding their way to Jama's Noah's Ark, they were found and made whole 51 again; and

52 WHEREAS, Jama Hedgecoth had a heart for creating positive change in the world around 53 her. Her faith was the cornerstone of her life, illuminating her path and guiding her actions 54 with love, grace, and, most prominently of all, a profound sense of purpose. Jama received 55 a vast array of accolades for her most notable contribution to the State of Georgia: founding 56 Noah's Ark Animal Sanctuary and Children's Care Home. Some of her awards include the 57 Greater Atlanta Veterinary Medical Society's Humanitarian of the Year Award, Mutual of 58 Omaha's Wildlife Heritage Center Award of Excellence, Henry County Chamber of 59 Commerce Woman of Substance Award, TBS Pathfinders Leadership Award, American 60 Family Coalition's Parent of the Year Award, Aurea McGarry's Inaugural Living Legend 61 Award, Turknett Leadership Group Leadership Character Award Nominee, Positive 62 Thinking Foundation's America Award for Personifying the American Character & Spirit,

63 Tommy Nobis Center's Galaxy of Stars Community Champion Award, and Eureka

- 64 Communities Award for Exemplary Service; and
- 65 WHEREAS, during her career Jama became an Honored Member of the US Registry's
- 66 "Who's Who" Among Outstanding Americans and received Proclamations of Honor from
- 67 the City of Locust Grove and the Henry County Board of Commissioners; and
- 68 WHEREAS, Jama was honored to receive Certificates of Appreciation from many
- 69 organizations whose causes she deeply admired, including the Georgia War Veteran's Home,
- 70 Operation Iraqi Freedom's 184th Ordnance Battalion (EOD), the Warrior Transition Battalion
- 71 of Fort Benning,, Henry County School System for Work Based Learning Program,
- 72 International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi, and Griffin Power Systems Wildlife Habitat and
- 73 Nature Trail. As a certified wildlife rehabilitator, Georgia's wild animals always held a
- 74 special place in her heart; and
- 75 WHEREAS, in remembering Jama Hedgecoth, we honor a remarkable woman whose
- 76 indomitable spirit touched the lives of many, leaving an enduring legacy of love, compassion,
- and faith. Through her visionary leadership, Noah's Ark became a haven for hundreds of
- 78 children and thousands of animals--a testament to her boundless compassion and
- 79 commitment to making a difference. Jama Hedgecoth will long be remembered for her love
- 80 of family, friendship, and community and will be missed by all who had the great fortune of
- 81 knowing her.
- 82 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 83 join in honoring the life and memory of Jama Hedgecoth and express their deepest and most
- 84 sincere regret at her passing.

85 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
