## A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, many Georgians require services and support tailored to their unique experiences and the challenges they face as veterans, particularly if they have suffered severe injuries or been exposed to traumatic events during their service; and

WHEREAS, many veterans suffer from chronic injuries, physical disabilities, addiction, mental illness, or other issues that may limit their ability to work or obtain housing; and

WHEREAS, a recent federal study by the Housing Assistance Council estimates that as many as 40,000 veterans in Georgia live in poverty and that nearly 700 veterans currently experience homelessness in Georgia; and

WHEREAS, promoting access to specialized services and housing is often a key step to ensuring that veterans and their families have the resources and support they need to thrive in the years following their military service; and

WHEREAS, the Senate should regularly evaluate the adequacy of public and private programs and services available in Georgia to provide these vital resources to veterans.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:
(1) Creation of Senate study committee. There is created the Senate Study Committee on Veterans' Mental Health and Housing.
(2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of five members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate, who shall designate one such member as chairperson of the committee.
(3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
(4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
(5) Allowances, expenses, and funding. The members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the Senate.

## (6) Report.

(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph $(\mathrm{C})$ of this paragraph.

(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
(C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee. A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with the Secretary of the Senate.
(D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
(7) Abolishment. The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2024.
