## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Joint Achievement Gap for Boys Study Committee; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, the education of its citizens is of primary importance to the State of Georgia;3 and

4 WHEREAS, access to quality education has a direct impact on the lives and well-being of5 the residents of this state; and

6 WHEREAS, the achievement gap is the disparity in educational attainment between different7 groups and it negatively affects individuals and society; and

8 WHEREAS, there is a need for professional development for instructional personnel and9 school administrators relating to the achievement gap for boys; and

10 WHEREAS, there is a need to develop curriculum, supplemental material, and classroom
11 activities in early learning programs and K-12 in order to close the achievement gap for boys;
12 and

13 WHEREAS, there is a need for academic, behavioral, and mental health supports to help

14 educate and raise young men who are better prepared for success in school and in life; and

15 WHEREAS, there is a need to examine evidence based strategies for closing the achievement
16 gap for boys and to make recommendations to the Georgia Department of Education and
17 General Assembly.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 GEORGIA:

20 (1) Creation of joint study committee. There is created the Joint Achievement Gap for
21 Boys Study Committee.

(2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of 11 members asfollows:

(A) The President of the Senate shall appoint three members of the Senate as members 24 25 of the committee. The chairperson of the Senate Education and Youth Committee shall 26 be one of the appointed members and shall be designated as a cochairperson. The 27 President of the Senate shall also appoint an additional two members of the committee 28 as follows: one teacher from a K-12 school and one principal from a K-12 school; and 29 (B) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three members of the 30 House of Representatives as members of the committee. The chairperson of the House 31 Education Committee shall be one of the appointed members and shall be designated 32 as a cochairperson. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall also appoint an 33 additional two members of the committee as follows: one teacher from a K-12 school 34 and one principal from a K-12 school; and

35 (C) The state school superintendent or his or her designee.

36 (3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
 37 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
 38 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

39 (4) Meetings. The cochairpersons shall call all meetings of the committee. The
40 committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem
41 necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform
42 its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

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## (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.

44 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided45 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

(B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members,
or state employees shall receive no compensation for their services on the committee,
but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their
duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed for
expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees.

51 (C) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state 52 employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that 53 specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia 54 Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state 55 employees.

56 (D) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received 57 by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are 58 authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come 59 from funds appropriated to the Senate and the House of Representatives; except that 50 funds for the reimbursement of the expenses of state officials, other than legislative 51 members, and state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise 52 available to their respective agencies.

63	(6) <b>Report.</b>
64	(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
65	include suggestions for proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file a report of the
66	same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
67	subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
68	(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
69	proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file the report, subject to
70	subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
71	(C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
72	abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
73	A report so approved shall be signed by the cochairpersons of the committee and filed
74	with the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
75	(D) In the absence of an approved report, the cochairpersons may file with the
76	Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives copies of the
77	minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.

78 (7) Abolishment. The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2022.
