A RESOLUTION

Recognizing February 2, 2024, as Clark Atlanta University Day (CAU) at the state capitol;
 and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University was established in 1988 upon the consolidation of its two parent institutions, Atlanta University, founded in 1865 by the American Missionary Association and the nation's first institution to award graduate degrees to African Americans; and Clark University, which was later changed to Clark College, established four years later in 1869 by the Freedman's Aid Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church (MEC) and the nation's first four-first year liberal arts college to serve a primarily African American population; and

WHEREAS, CAU is one of the top performers on Social Mobility in the nation, ranked at number 69; the CAU School of Education is ranked as the number three school of education in State of Georgia; the School of Business is ranked number nine among MBA programs in the State of Georgia; the CAU Whitney M. Young, Jr., School of Social Work is ranked number five and is the first school of social work to be accredited in the State of Georgia; according to the most recent *U.S. News and World Report;* and WHEREAS, the university's four schools, Arts and Sciences, Business Administration,
Education, and Social Work, offer 40 academic programs to 3,920 students annually, making
a valuable contribution to the future workforce, including training for technology,
engineering, and education and contributing to the leadership of Georgia; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University's economic impact to the state of Georgia boasts \$541
million in combined gross sales, a direct impact of \$400 million, and 3,282 full and part-time

22 jobs that contribute to Georgia's economy; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is a founding member of the Georgia Research Alliance and the home of the Center for Cancer Research and Therapeutic Development, which has the distinction of being one of the nation's largest academic prostate cancer research centers, providing opportunities for high caliber basic and translational research, training the next generation of scientists in cancer research, and offering an educational environment for community outreach, prevention, early detection, and treatment of prostate cancer; and

30 WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is the home of the Center for Innovation and 31 Entrepreneurship Development, one of the nation's most progressive forums integrating 32 traditional academics, market research and intelligence, and innovation to increase the level 33 of competitiveness among CAU graduates and local entrepreneurs; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is the first private historically black university to host
a chapter of Phi Kappa Phi, America's most prestigious honor society for all academic
disciplines, in addition to Golden Key International Honor Society, Phi Eta Sigma Honor
Society, and Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society, as well as several discipline-specific honor
societies; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is an important contributor to local, regional, and national communities, engaging more than 1,000 student and faculty volunteers annually in service to local nonprofit organizations; supporting the educational systems of Fulton, DeKalb, Cobb, Gwinnett, Rockdale, and nearby Georgia counties; and continuing to reach beyond the campus footprint to address critical issues through purposeful service; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is the home of WCLK Jazz 91.9 FM, Atlanta's Jazz
Station, a National Public Radio (*NPR*) affiliate celebrating 50 years of service to the
community; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University has produced stellar alumni who represent 47 irreplaceable threads in the fabric of the State of Georgia and America as a whole, including: 48 49 Fletcher Henderson, AU '19; former Georgia State Representative Grace Towns Hamilton, 50 AU '27; Irma Jackson Clayton Wertz, AU '35; Evelyn Gibson Lowery, CC '46; Mary Frances 51 Early, CC '57; the Honorable Brenda Hill Cole, AU '67; Georgia State Representative Shelia 52 Jones, CC '78; Kenny Leon, CC '79; Helen Smith Price, AU '81; Georgia State Senator 53 Horacena Tate, AU '88, CAU '92; Anthony White, CAU '99; Bomani Jones, CAU '01; 54 Tharon Johnson, CAU '02; and Lorin Crawford, CAU '13; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is now under the leadership of President George T.
French Jr., the longest serving HBCU president in the United States, who is now applying
his considerable experience and expertise, wisdom, and passion for advocacy toward a better
future for the young men and women of Clark Atlanta University; and

59 WHEREAS, under his leadership in 2022, CAU has embarked on a \$250 million 60 comprehensive endowment campaign; a few initiatives within the campaign include

WHEREAS, under the leadership of President French, Clark Atlanta University has received
the largest unrestricted donation in the university's history from philanthropist Mackenzie
Scott totaling \$15 million; and

66 WHEREAS, President French has stewarded the addition of the Propel Center, which will 67 support Clark Atlanta University, the Atlanta University Center, and the entire HBCU 68 community, which includes more than 107colleges and universities, through a robust virtual 69 platform accessible to all HBCU students and faculty. The founding partners, Apple and 70 Southern Company, along with strategic partner the Walt Disney Company, have each made 71 major investments toward the development and launch of the center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body recognize and commend Clark Atlanta University; Dr. George T. French Jr., President of Clark Atlanta University; and its students, faculty, staff, alumni, colleagues, and friends for their many years of dedicated service to the higher education of Georgia's citizens and for attracting young scholars from across the nation to our great state.
