## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing February 28, 2024, as the Georgia Association of Broadcasters Day at the state  
2 capitol; and for other purposes.

7 association, founded in July 1934 at the De Soto Hotel in Savannah, Georgia; and

9 represent the interest of air radio and television licensees and is composed of more than 400  
10 radio and television broadcasters; and
