A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and commending Brooks A. Keel, PhD, for his dedicated service to advancing
- 2 higher education in the State of Georgia, the University System of Georgia, Georgia
- 3 Southern University, and Augusta University; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, Brooks A. Keel, PhD, is a native son of the State of Georgia, born and raised
- 5 in Augusta, and a distinguished member of the Augusta community; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he attended and graduated from both of Augusta University's legacy
- 7 institutions, earning a bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry from Augusta College in
- 8 1978 and a doctorate in reproductive endocrinology from the Medical College of Georgia in
- 9 1982; and
- 10 WHEREAS, following graduation, he rose to the standing of an internationally recognized
- 11 expert in reproductive medicine, serving as a member of the Society for the Study of
- 12 Reproduction, the American Society for Reproductive Medicine, and the Society for
- 13 Gynecologic Investigation, among others; and
- 14 WHEREAS, he served on numerous boards, including the American Board of Bioanalysis,
- 15 the American Association of Bioanalysts as both president and chair, the Oak Ridge

16 Associated Universities, the Southeastern Universities Research Association, and the

- 17 Executive Committee of the Council on Research Policy and Graduate Education of APLU;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, as a basic science and clinical researcher, he served as principal investigator or
- 20 co-principal investigator on externally funded grants and contracts totaling more than \$26
- 21 million; and
- 22 WHEREAS, he is the author of 65 peer-reviewed scientific publications, 78 peer-reviewed
- 23 abstracts, and 19 book chapters and has edited four books in the areas of reproductive
- 24 medicine and biology; and
- 25 WHEREAS, he worked for 20 years as a professor and researcher before moving into
- 26 administration; and
- 27 WHEREAS, while serving as president of Georgia Southern University (GSU) in Statesboro,
- 28 he focused on expanding undergraduate and graduate education through research and
- 29 community experience; and
- 30 WHEREAS, under his leadership, GSU launched the Allen E. Paulson College of
- 31 Engineering and Information Technology and the Institute for Interdisciplinary STEM
- 32 Education; and
- 33 WHEREAS, during his tenure at Augusta University, it has expanded its academic offerings
- 34 and campus infrastructure through the founding of the School of Computer and Cyber
- 35 Sciences, the School of Public Health, Augusta University Online, the Transdisciplinary
- 36 Research Initiative in Inflammaging and Brain Aging, the Immunology Center of Georgia,

37 the four-year Medical College of Georgia Partnership Campus in Savannah, a new College

- 38 of Science and Mathematics building, two on-campus residence halls, and a major expansion
- 39 of research laboratory space in the M. Bert Storey Cancer Research Building; and
- 40 WHEREAS, under his leadership, Augusta University's Medical College of Georgia created
- 41 the 3+ Primary Care Pathway Program to guide more medical students toward primary care
- 42 careers in Georgia to improve the health of all Georgians, particularly those in rural and other
- 43 underserved areas; and
- 44 WHEREAS, during his tenure, the Medical College of Georgia, Dental College of Georgia,
- 45 and the College of Nursing have created partnerships to expand education outreach
- 46 throughout the state to meet the critical health care needs of rural and other underserved areas
- 47 as well as the evolving educational needs and professional career imperatives of health care
- 48 students; and
- 49 WHEREAS, under his leadership, Augusta University increased enrollment by more than 27
- 50 percent, increased National Institutes of Health funding by 37 percent, and increased Augusta
- 51 University's economic impact on the state by 48 percent; and
- 52 WHEREAS, under his leadership, Augusta University is today the only university in the
- 53 country that has more than \$50 million in annual NIH funding while also being part of the
- 54 United States Cyber Command's Academic Engagement Network and in the top 5 percent
- 55 of universities that improve economic outcomes for students with low- and moderate-income
- 56 backgrounds; and
- 57 WHEREAS, he has been named to Georgia Trend's list of 100 Most Influential Georgians
- 58 for 10 consecutive years; and

59 WHEREAS, he is highly respected amongst his peers as a tireless advocate for ensuring all

- 60 Georgians have access to a quality education and world-class health care; and
- 61 WHEREAS, it is abundantly proper and fitting that the accomplishments of this remarkable
- 62 and distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized on the occasion of his retirement.
- 63 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 64 commend Brooks A. Keel, PhD, for his dedicated service to the University System of
- 65 Georgia, higher education, and health care in the State of Georgia and beyond as well as
- 66 Georgia Southern University and Augusta University, without which students would not have
- 67 access to quality education and research would not have been conducted and health care
- 68 access would not have expanded as broadly across the state.
