A RESOLUTION

1	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to provide for the dedication of revenue
2	derived from the regulation of athletic and entertainment events held in this state to be used
3	for certain purposes and not deposited into the general fund; to provide for related matters;
4	to provide for submission of this amendment for ratification or rejection; and for other
5	purposes.
6	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
7	SECTION 1.
8	Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI of the Constitution is amended by adding a new
9	subparagraph to read as follows:
10	"(o) The General Assembly may provide by general law to dedicate any part or all of the
11	proceeds of any fees or other moneys received by a commission in this state for the purpose
12	of regulating athletic and entertainment events held in this state to be used by the collecting
13	commission for the purposes of regulating and licensing athletic and entertainment events
14	held in this state, and such proceeds shall not be required to be deposited into the general
15	fund. Such moneys shall not be subject to the provisions of Article III, Section IX,
16	Paragraph IV(c)."
17	SECTION 2.
18	The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as
19	provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the
20	above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following:
21	"() YES Shall the Constitution be amended so as to provide for the dedication of
22	revenue derived from the regulation of athletic and entertainment events
23	() NO held in this state to be used for such regulatory purposes and not deposited
24	into the general fund?"
25	All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes."
26	All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If

- such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall
- 28 become a part of the Constitution of this state.
