A RESOLUTION

- 1 Expressing concerns regarding regulatory overreach impacting the chemical industry and
- 2 urging the federal government to reevaluate proposed restrictions; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia recognizes the vital role played by the chemical industry
- 4 in the economic development, national security, and technological innovation of the United
- 5 States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the chemical industry is a cornerstone of our nation's economy, contributing
- 7 over \$600 billion in economic impact, supporting more than half a million jobs, and
- 8 constituting 25% of the gross domestic product and, in Georgia, supports over 20,000 jobs
- 9 as a \$13 billion industry; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the chemical industry is instrumental in providing essential products and
- 11 innovations that drive progress in areas such as housing, infrastructure, healthcare,
- 12 telecommunications, and clean energy solutions; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the success of the chemical industry is crucial to maintaining America's global
- 14 competitiveness and achieving national priorities; and

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15 WHEREAS, recent regulatory actions and proposed restrictions by the Biden administration

- 16 and its agencies have raised concerns about the impact on the chemical industry's ability to
- 17 innovate, create products, and contribute to the nation's economic growth; and
- 18 WHEREAS, these new restrictions have the potential to limit access to and increase the cost
- 19 of essential products, negatively impacting the United States economy, jeopardizing
- 20 American competitiveness, and delaying progress in industries with urgent and growing
- 21 needs; and
- 22 WHEREAS, there are currently 13 proposed new restrictions with the potential to directly
- 23 impact the chemical industry, ranging from outright bans on certain chemistries to
- 24 regulations that may render manufacturing unviable or impossible; and
- 25 WHEREAS, these restrictions may have detrimental effects on the supply chains for vital
- 26 technologies, including semiconductors, electric vehicles, and modern healthcare
- 27 applications; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the proposed restrictions contradict policy priorities set forth by laws such as
- 29 the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), and CHIPS
- 30 and Science Ac; and
- 31 WHEREAS, responsible regulation that prioritizes science, promotes innovation, and
- 32 supports supply chain resiliency is essential to achieving national goals.
- 33 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 34 GEORGIA that:

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35 (1) The Georgia General Assembly expresses concern about the potential adverse impact

- 36 of regulatory overreach on the chemical industry and its contributions to the nation's
- 37 economic prosperity;
- 38 (2) The Georgia General Assembly calls on the Biden Administration, federal agencies,
- 39 and Congress to reevaluate proposed restrictions on the chemical industry, ensuring that
- 40 regulations are based on sound science, promote innovation, and support supply chain
- 41 resiliency; and
- 42 (3) The Georgia General Assembly urges the Administration, Federal agencies, and
- 43 Congress to support frameworks that celebrate innovation and accelerate progress in the
- 44 chemical industry.
- 45 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 46 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the President of the
- 47 United States, the Georgia Congressional delegation, and relevant federal agencies to inform
- 48 them of the concerns and recommendations expressed herein.
