## **ADOPTED SENATE**

## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Dyslexia; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, dyslexia is a specific learning disability that is neurological in origin; and
- 3 WHEREAS, dyslexia is the most common learning disability, affecting approximately one
- 4 in five individuals and approximately 80 percent of all individuals with a learning disability;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, the condition is often unexpected because those it affects can have a very high
- 7 level of intelligence but read at a much lower level; and
- 8 WHEREAS, dyslexia causes difficulty with phoneme segmentation, the ability to break
- 9 words down into individual sounds; and
- 10 WHEREAS, an individual with dyslexia may have weaknesses in decoding and reading
- 11 fluency, but they are often surrounded by a sea of strengths in reasoning, problem solving,
- 12 concept formation, critical thinking, and vocabulary; and
- 13 WHEREAS, early diagnosis is critical to early remediation with evidence based intervention
- 14 for individuals with dyslexia that leads to self-awareness, self-empowerment, self-esteem,
- 15 and necessary accommodations to ensure student, school, and life success; and
- 16 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper to draw attention to the profound educational
- 17 impact of dyslexia on the education and lives of countless children, adults, and students in
- 18 the State of Georgia.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:
- 20 (1) **Creation of Senate study committee.** There is created the Senate Study Committee
- on Dyslexia.

22 (2) **Members and officers**. The committee shall be composed of three members of the

- 23 Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate and two members appointed by the
- Governor, one of whom shall be an employee of the Department of Education and one
- of whom shall be a medical doctor with a specialty in dyslexia. The President shall
- designate a member of the committee as chairperson of the committee.
- 27 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 30 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 34 (5) **Allowances and funding.** The legislative members of the committee shall receive
- 35 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- 37 member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
- Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the Senate.
- 40 (6) **Report.**
- 41 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 45 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- 47 of this paragraph.
- 48 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 51 the Secretary of the Senate.
- 52 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary
- of the Senate copies of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 54 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2018.
