A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 26, 2020, as Community Midwives National Alliance Day at the state
- 2 capitol; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, a community midwife is a specialist in low-risk maternal care; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the hallmarks of midwifery emphasize community-based interpersonal
- 5 relationships, health promotion with preventive care, health education, continuity care,
- 6 recognition of abnormalities in early stages, and skillful communication with a collaborative
- 7 healthcare team, such as physicians, mid-level providers, and specialists; and
- 8 WHEREAS, this great State of Georgia has a centuries-old history of midwives giving
- 9 conscientious care to the women in their communities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, through the ages, there have been revered, community-chosen midwives
- 11 throughout the world; and
- 12 WHEREAS, community midwives have close relationships with their clients and emphasize
- 13 total wellness; and
- 14 WHEREAS, in 93 Georgia counties, labor and delivery units have closed and there are no
- 15 obstetricians or midwives; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Georgia is in a maternal health state of emergency and is ranked fiftieth in the
- 17 nation for maternal demise; and
- 18 WHEREAS, having the help of a community midwife is a safe option for low-risk women;
- 19 by practicing preventive care, midwives could help save millions of dollars for taxpayers,
- 20 families, and the healthcare system; and

21 WHEREAS, Georgia-certified community midwives have met the International

- 22 Confederation of Midwifery (ICM) standards, recommended as a safe option by the
- 23 American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology and, globally, by the World Health
- 24 Organization; and
- 25 WHEREAS, the majority of midwives practicing globally and meeting the ICM standards
- are direct-entry midwives; currently, direct-entry midwives are chosen in 70 percent of the
- 27 United States; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the World Health Organization states, "Nurses and midwives are the backbone
- 29 of every health system: in 2020, we're calling on all countries to invest in nurses and
- 30 midwives as part of their commitment to health for all"; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the World Health Assembly, the governing body of the World Health
- 32 Organization, has designated 2020 as the year of the nurse and the midwife to advance
- 33 nurses' and midwives' vital roles in transforming healthcare around the world; and
- 34 WHEREAS, "Every Community Deserves a Midwife"; and
- 35 WHEREAS, community midwives offer hope, expertise, and an exemplary opportunity to
- 36 impact maternal well-being in the year of the midwife and the nurse.
- 37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 38 recognize February 26, 2020, as Community Midwives National Alliance Day at the state
- 39 capitol.

- 41 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
