A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Clayton County Public Schools for its achievements on behalf of Clayton
- 2 County and recognizing February 23, 2018, as Clayton County Public Schools Day at the
- 3 state capitol; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) is fully accredited through
- 5 AdvancED-Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Councils on Accreditation and
- 6 School Improvement as of June 2016; and
- 7 WHEREAS, CCPS is the fifth largest school system in the State of Georgia and one of the
- 8 top 100 largest school systems in the nation; and
- 9 WHEREAS, CCPS offers a world class education grounded in instructional priorities of
- 10 literacy, numeracy, critical thinking, and technology integration for nearly 55,000 students
- at 65 learning sites, including various industry-certified Career, Technical, and Agricultural
- 12 Education (CTAE) pathways, fine arts magnet programs, and dual language academies; and
- 13 it houses the second middle school in the State of Georgia to be awarded a STEM
- 14 certification program by the Georgia Department of Education; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the Clayton County Board of Education unanimously elected Dr. Morcease J.
- 16 Beasley to serve as superintendent and CEO on May 8, 2017; and
- 17 WHEREAS, CCPS has become one of the highest performing school systems in the State
- 18 of Georgia and the nation by establishing five critical areas of focus, including academically
- 19 challenging and supportive instructional environments; academic and nonacademic support
- 20 for students; professional development in content, pedagogy, and leadership capacity; family
- and community engagement and communications; and public relations and marketing; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the school system has adopted a school improvement framework, known as the
- 23 Nine Characteristics of High Performing Schools, to establish autonomy and accountability

24 measures for school and district leaders, to achieve coherence, and to more effectively

- 25 produce district-wide improvements and increases in student achievement outcomes; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Clayton County Public Schools' current graduation rate is 69.9 percent, with
- 27 five schools experiencing improvement in 2016-2017; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the graduation rate for all Career, Technical, and Agricultural Education
- 29 (CTAE) concentrators is 92.8 percent; and
- 30 WHEREAS, two CCPS schools were among 142 schools state wide to rank on the 2017
- 31 Highest Performing Award list by the Governor's Office of Student Achievement by earning
- 32 a three-year average College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) achievement
- 33 score in the 93rd percentile; and
- 34 WHEREAS, 70 percent of eligible schools outperformed expectations by surpassing their
- 35 predicted CCRPI scores, which is the second highest percentage among the six largest
- 36 districts state wide; and
- 37 WHEREAS, CCPS achieved its largest increase in the district's overall 2016-2017 CCRPI
- 38 score since CCRPI data was first implemented and outperformed the state-wide growth
- 39 percentage by 2.3 percentage points; and
- 40 WHEREAS, the school system has been recognized by the College Board as one of two
- 41 school systems in the State of Georgia that creates opportunities for traditionally
- 42 underrepresented students in higher education; and
- 43 WHEREAS, CCPS has increased stakeholder engagement and community support by
- 44 expanding communications efforts to involve all facets of the Clayton County community
- 45 by establishing Superintendent Advisory Groups and holding Critical Conversation meetings;
- 46 and
- 47 WHEREAS, the school system continues to create new relationships and rely on established
- 48 partnerships with local businesses, organizations, and colleges to provide opportunities for
- 49 all stakeholders to participate in the district's educational process; and
- 50 WHEREAS, CCPS annually participates in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)
- 51 program to offer healthy breakfast and lunch to all students for free, thus garnering the

52 Nutrition Services Department Outstanding Achievement Award from the Georgia

- 53 Department of Education for providing healthy school meals; and
- 54 WHEREAS, the CCPS Department of Transportation is recognized as one of the top
- 55 transportation departments in Georgia in the area of emissions reduction; and
- 56 WHEREAS, CCPS is recognized as an Asthma-Friendly School System by the Georgia
- 57 Department of Public Health, and it is the second school system to receive this designation
- 58 in the State of Georgia; and
- 59 WHEREAS, the CCPS Department of Business Services is the recipient of the 2017 Annual
- 60 Achievement of Excellence in Procurement Award; and
- WHEREAS, CCPS is one of 13 agencies in Georgia and one of only 26 school districts in
- 62 the United States and Canada to be honored for achievement in best practices.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 64 commend Clayton County Public Schools for its achievements on behalf of the communities
- 65 it represents and recognize February 23, 2018, as Clayton County Public Schools Day at the
- 66 state capitol.
- 67 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 68 to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to Clayton County
