A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing November 1, 2024, as Diwali Day; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, Diwali is one of the most important and ancient holidays, celebrated by more
than 1 billion people of different cultures and religions across the world, and has been in
existence for more than 5,000 years; and

5 WHEREAS, there are more than 200,000 people in Georgia and millions of Americans6 across the country who observe Diwali every year; and

7 WHEREAS, Diwali symbolizes the victory of light over darkness, good over evil, and8 knowledge over ignorance; and

9 WHEREAS, the festival holds deep cultural, religious, and social significance as well as
10 marks a time of renewal, reflection, and the triumph of positivity in the face of adversity.
11 Diwali is also known as a time for dana and seva - giving of charity and selfless service to

WHEREAS, during Diwali, families and communities come together to illuminate their
homes with diyas (oil lamps) and vibrant decorations, creating a warm and welcoming
atmosphere that fosters unity and togetherness; and

WHEREAS, the diverse traditions associated with Diwali, including the exchange of sweets,
the worship of deities, and the bursting of fireworks, contribute to the rich tapestry of our

19 WHEREAS, Diwali serves as a reminder of the importance of compassion, generosity, and

20 the pursuit of knowledge in building harmonious societies; and

WHEREAS, Georgia has long been a place that welcomes, honors, and supports the diversearray of practices, beliefs, and traditions among its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
recognize November 1, 2024, as Diwali Day.
