A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing September 2024 as Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that 19,680 cases of ovarian cancer will
- 3 be newly diagnosed in 2024, including 620 new cases in Georgia alone; and
- 4 WHEREAS, ovarian cancer mainly develops in older women with about half of the women
- 5 who are diagnosed being 63 years or older, and it is more common in White women than
- 6 Black women; and
- 7 WHEREAS, some early cancers may have signs and symptoms that can be noticed, and
- 8 catching cancer early often allows for more treatment options, but that is not always the case
- 9 with ovarian cancer because the symptoms are often vague and no early detection test exists;
- 10 and
- WHEREAS, the five-year survival rate from ovarian cancer is only 50 percent, and survival
- 12 rates vary greatly depending on the stage of diagnosis; and
- WHEREAS, unfortunately, there are currently no effective diagnostic tools for screening for

WHEREAS, increasing awareness among patients and health care providers alike regarding

- ovarian cancer is a key component in safeguarding women's health; and
- 17 WHEREAS, everyone is encouraged to promote additional awareness by using social media
- 18 to spread the word by using the hashtags #ovariancancerawarenessmonth or #ocam,
- 19 especially during the month of September; and
- 20 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper to recognize the Ovarian Cancer Research
- 21 Alliance (OCRA) and Georgia's Advocates for their outstanding efforts to bring ovarian
- 22 cancer awareness and education to the State of Georgia to help reduce late stage diagnoses
- 23 and hopefully someday prevent ovarian cancer.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 25 recognize September 2024 as Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month and encourage support for
- 26 all women at risk of or diagnosed with ovarian cancer as well as other cancers.
- 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 28 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the Georgia Chapter
- of the Ovarian Cancer Research Alliance, the public, and the press.
