A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 20, 2018, as Female Veterans Legislative Day at the state capitol; and
- 2 for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, women are a vital part of the armed forces and the community of veterans, and
- 4 they have formally been a part of the armed forces of the United States since the inception
- 5 of Army Nurse Corps in 1901, but have proudly served alongside and supported our nation's
- 6 military since the American Revolution; and
- 7 WHEREAS, women veterans account for approximately 10 percent of the veteran population
- 8 in the United States and their ranks are expected to grow to 15 percent by 2030; though many
- 9 of their challenges and opportunities are similar to those of their male counterparts, some are
- 10 unique or disproportionate to the population of women veterans, which is younger and more
- ethnically diverse than its male cohort; and by 2045, the number of women veterans in the
- 12 nation will rise to 2.2 million, nearly doubling the share of women veterans to 18 percent;

- 14 WHEREAS, we will endeavor to always honor the contributions and sacrifices of the
- 15 millions of Georgians who have, over the centuries, served in the military and the tens of
- 16 thousands presently serving, both at home and abroad; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia is home to more than 752,000 veterans, of which more than
- 18 93,000 are women veterans, in addition to being the home of tens of thousands of the nation's
- 19 military families; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Georgia salutes and remembers the many American women veterans who have
- 21 courageously and honorably served in the military on behalf of our nation; and
- 22 WHEREAS, on this day, we commemorate the fearless service of women who have served
- 23 our nation in the armed forces of the United States, and we honor our women veterans and

24 their families for their remarkable sacrifices and outstanding contributions to the State of

- 25 Georgia.
- 26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 27 commend the service of women veterans and recognize February 20, 2018, as Female
- 28 Veterans Legislative Day at the state capitol.
- 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 30 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
- 31 press.
