A RESOLUTION

- 1 Congratulating Special Olympics Georgia on its 50th anniversary; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Special Olympics Georgia has grown into a state-wide force, serving 26,681
3 athletes and offering 26 sports to athletes of all different ages and abilities to the disabled not
4 just in Georgia but throughout the Southeast as well; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the mission of Special Olympics Georgia is to provide year-round sports
6 training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for all children and
7 adults with intellectual disabilities, giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical
8 fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy, and participate in the sharing of gifts, skills,
9 and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes, and the community; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Special Olympics Georgia has five main state games held throughout the year,
11 taking place in the Atlanta area, Warner Robins, and Valdosta to best reach out to athletes
12 across the State of Georgia; and
- 13 WHEREAS, it has also evolved to not only serve the intellectually disabled athletically but
14 also to provide free healthcare screenings at all its state events through its Healthy Athletes
15 program; and
- 16 WHEREAS, due to Healthy Athletes free health screenings, training for healthcare
17 professionals, and evaluation of the health status of the intellectually disabled, Special
18 Olympics is now the world's largest public health organization for such individuals; and
- 19 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper to recognize and congratulate Special
20 Olympics Georgia on its accomplishments over its 50 year history.
- 21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
22 congratulate Special Olympics Georgia on its 50th anniversary.
