Senate Resolution 919

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring Father Augustus Tolton; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Father Augustus Tolton is the first publicly recognized Black Roman Catholic
- 3 Priest in America, born to Peter and Martha Tolton on April 1, 1854, in Missouri, and
- 4 labored in the field at just seven years of age alongside his brother, Charley; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Father Tolton labored among us during times of contradiction that proved to be
- 6 both beautiful and paradoxical; and
- 7 WHEREAS, both of his parents were slaves, and Augustus and his two siblings had the
- 8 knowledge of the Catholic faith bestowed upon them while being taught how to live it; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Father Tolton attended St. Boniface's parish school, which was an all-white
- school, and his presence there was not well received; and
- 11 WHEREAS, he was burdened with many threats at school from other students, and as a
- 12 result received his daily lessons after school in order to avoid the torment and insults thrown
- 13 upon him by his peers; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Father Tolton was eventually taken out of school, until Father Peter McGirr
- 15 made it possible for him to return to Catholic School; and
- 16 WHEREAS, he began to work at a tobacco factory, and before going to work he would serve
- 17 at Mass; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Father Tolton applied to various seminaries throughout the country, but was not
- 19 accepted because they were not ready to accept a black student; and

20 WHEREAS, no religious order or seminary would allow Father Tolton to join, but during the

- 21 interim period of his waiting to be accepted to one, he was able to receive temporary tutoring
- 22 that would allow him to prepare for seminary school; and
- 23 WHEREAS, on February 15, 1880, Father Tolton left Quincy in order to go to Rome, in
- 24 which he arrived on March 10 of the same year; and
- 25 WHEREAS, he studied at seminary in Rome for six years, during which time he had a very
- 26 positive experience; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Father Tolton celebrated his first Mass in Quincy at St. Boniface Church on
- 28 July 18, 1886; and
- 29 WHEREAS, he was assigned to be pastor of St. Joseph's Church and school, and many
- 30 people were drawn to his beautiful homilies, spiritual guidance, and sense of goodness; and
- 31 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the faith, determination, and bravery of
- 32 Father Augustus Tolton to overcome all odds and become the first publicly recognized Black
- 33 Roman Catholic Priest in America be appropriately recognized.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 35 honor Father Augustus Tolton.
- 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 37 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
- 38 press.
