

Senate Resolution 923

A RESOLUTION

1 Commending police chiefs and other heads of law enforcement agencies in this state and
2 recognizing Wednesday, February 12, 2014, as Police Chiefs and Heads of Law Enforcement
3 Agencies Recognition Day at the capitol; and for other purposes.

4 WHEREAS, in the State of Georgia, there are more than 700 police chiefs and heads of law
5 enforcement agencies who provide a critical service, managing approximately 45,000 sworn
6 peace officers; and

7 WHEREAS, the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police is an organization of honorable men
8 and women dedicated to the preservation of life and property of Georgia citizens in a
9 professional and ethical manner; and

10 WHEREAS, these brave law enforcement leaders provide public service above and beyond
11 the call of duty, often at great personal risk and tremendous sacrifice not only of themselves,
12 but also of their families; and

13 WHEREAS, from the time of their initial police chief training provided by the Georgia
14 Association of Chiefs of Police, and throughout their careers, each member has demonstrated
15 continuous loyalty to the call to serve and has combined and increased their public safety
16 effectiveness through cooperation with state, county, and local governmental officials; and

17 WHEREAS, police chiefs and heads of law enforcement agencies of Georgia support the
18 continuous elevation of standards and training of law enforcement managers and have been
19 instrumental in increasing the public's awareness of methods for avoiding being victims of
20 crime; and

21 WHEREAS, it is only fitting and proper that the police chiefs and heads of law enforcement
22 agencies of Georgia be recognized for their many personal sacrifices and outstanding and
23 courageous contributions to the citizens of this state.

24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
25 commend each police chief and head of a law enforcement agency in this state for his or her
26 outstanding commitment to the people of this state.

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Police Chiefs and Heads of Law Enforcement Agencies
28 Recognition Day, Wednesday, February 12, 2014, is being observed in recognition and honor
29 of all police chiefs and heads of law enforcement agencies in the State of Georgia.

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
31 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to Police Chief David L. Lyons, President
32 of the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police, and Frank V. Rotondo, Executive Director
33 of the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police.
