## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Cullen Chambers; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
- 3 with the passing of Cullen Chambers on January 20, 2014; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Cullen was an established historic preservationist and executive director of the
- 5 Tybee Island Historical Society on Tybee Island, Georgia; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he was responsible for all operations at the Tybee Island Lighthouse Complex,
- 7 which included several historical cottages and a museum, and was an integral figure in
- 8 several restoration projects on the island; and
- 9 WHEREAS, in his 20 years working on Tybee, Cullen saw many of his visions become
- 10 reality and was often recognized with awards for his work, yet he never sought the limelight
- and often spread this recognition amongst his peers; and
- 12 WHEREAS, even as Cullen guided preservation and restoration efforts on Tybee Island, he
- often consulted and volunteered on projects across the country; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Cullen also assisted in an effort to preserve and restore a 1920's-era one-room
- schoolhouse on St. Simons Island called the Harrington School; this was the primary grade
- school for black children who lived on the island and is the last remaining link to its
- 17 Gullah-Geechee culture; and
- 18 WHEREAS, with his role in the Historic Preservation Technical Advisory Committee of the
- 19 Coastal Regional Commission, Cullen worked with the Georgia Trust and the St. Simon's
- 20 African American Heritage Coalition to keep the schoolhouse standing; and

21 WHEREAS, Cullen is survived by his loving wife Christine, twin brother, Curtis Chambers,

- and his younger brother, Roy Lain; and
- WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern
- 24 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his
- 25 family and friends were admired by others; and
- 26 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
- 27 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness and, by the example he made of his life, he
- 28 made this world a better place in which to live.
- 29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 30 join in honoring the life and memory of Cullen Chambers and express their deepest and most
- 31 sincere regret at his passing.
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 33 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the family of Cullen Chambers.
