- 4 WHEREAS, Georgia Bio, founded in 1989, is a nonprofit, membership-based organization
- 5 that promotes the interests and growth of the life sciences industry; and
- 6 WHEREAS, members include companies, universities, research institutions, government
- 7 groups, and other industry associations involved in discovery and application of life sciences
- 8 products and related services that improve the health and well-being of people throughout
- 9 the world; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Georgia Bio's mission is to advance the growth of Georgia's life sciences
- industry and foster strategic partnerships that can create a healthier world; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Georgia Bio conducts business and economic development activities; advocates
- on behalf of the industry on public policy matters; educates the public about the benefits of
- 14 life sciences research and product development; and provides a network for the exchange of
- 15 ideas, information, and opportunities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Georgia Bio runs the Georgia BioEd Institute, a charitable nonprofit
- organization committed to Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM)
- 18 education with a focus in biotechnology and medtech in Georgia through school programs,
- 19 workforce training, and lifelong learning; and
- 20 WHEREAS, there are more than 360 life sciences companies in Georgia, most of them
- 21 focused on healthcare applications, ranging from established to start-up pharmaceutical
- 22 biotechnology, medical device, diagnostic, medical supply, and medical informatics
- 23 companies; and contract laboratory, preclinical, and clinical research organizations; and

24 WHEREAS, the life sciences industry and university research, plus the United States Centers

- 25 for Disease Control and Prevention, have a \$20 billion annual economic impact on Georgia
- and employ more than 94,000 people, and the life sciences industry alone employs more than
- 27 65,000 people and has an economic impact of nearly \$17 billion; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Georgia's life sciences industry pays nearly \$5.6 billion in salaries and more
- 29 than \$550 million per year in state and local taxes, making it a positive force on this state's
- 30 economy.
- 31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 32 commend Georgia Bio for the advancements it has made in the life sciences industry as well
- as the positive impact it has on this state's economy, recognize January 28, 2015, as Georgia
