A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 23, 2021, as Dyslexia Day at the state capitol and urging schools, local
- 2 educational agencies, and the state educational agency to address the profound educational
- 3 impact of dyslexia; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, dyslexia is a specific learning disability that is neurological in origin; and
- 5 WHEREAS, dyslexia is the most common learning disability, affecting approximately one
- 6 in five individuals and approximately 80 percent of all individuals with a learning disability;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, the condition is often unexpected because those it affects can have a very high
- 9 level of intelligence but read at a much lower level; and
- 10 WHEREAS, dyslexia causes difficulty with phoneme segmentation, the ability to break
- 11 words down into individual sounds; and
- 12 WHEREAS, an individual with dyslexia may have weaknesses in decoding and reading
- 13 fluency, but they are often surrounded by a sea of strengths in reasoning, problem solving,
- 14 concept formation, critical thinking, and vocabulary; and

15 WHEREAS, early diagnosis is critical for early remediation and evidence-based intervention

- 16 that leads to self-awareness, self-empowerment, self-esteem, and necessary accommodations
- 17 to ensure student, school, and life success; and
- 18 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper to draw attention to the profound educational
- 19 impact of dyslexia on the education and lives of countless children, adults, and students in
- 20 the State of Georgia.
- 21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 22 recognize February 23, 2021, as Dyslexia Day at the state capitol and urge all schools, local
- 23 and state educational agencies, and educators to recognize the profound educational impact
- 24 of dyslexia.
- 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 26 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
