ADOPTED SENATE

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Surgical Smoke Evacuation Systems; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, surgical smoke is the gaseous by-product produced from the interaction of tools
- 4 or heat-producing equipment used for dissection and hemostasis during surgical or invasive
- 5 procedures; and
- 6 WHEREAS, surgical smoke contains infectious bacteria, viruses, and chemicals that include
- 7 proven toxins, mutagens, carcinogens, and allergens; and
- 8 WHEREAS, an estimated 500,000 health care workers are exposed to surgical smoke each
- 9 year, according to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration; and
- 10 WHEREAS, exposure to these substances can cause short- and long-term health problems,
- such as eye, nose, and throat irritation, and possible long-term illnesses, such as emphysema,
- 12 asthma, and chronic bronchitis; and
- 13 WHEREAS, surgical smoke evacuation systems used during surgical procedures can protect
- 14 patients and health care workers from the hazards of surgical smoke; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Rhode Island and Colorado have laws requiring hospitals to install surgical
- smoke evacuation equipment in all surgery rooms in hospitals and ambulatory surgical
- 17 centers; and
- 18 WHEREAS, it would be beneficial to study the efficacy and cost of surgical smoke
- 19 evacuation systems in surgery rooms.
- 20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

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21 (1) **Creation of Senate study committee**. There is created the Senate Study Committee

- on Surgical Smoke Evacuation Systems.
- 23 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The President shall designate a
- legislative member of the committee as chairperson of the committee.
- 26 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 29 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 31 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 33 (5) **Allowances and funding.** The legislative members of the committee shall receive
- 34 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 35 Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
- Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the Senate.
- 39 (6) **Report.**
- 40 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- 41 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 44 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- of this paragraph.
- 47 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- 49 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 50 the Secretary of the Senate.
- 51 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary
- of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 53 (7) **Abolishment**. The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2020.
