2	RELATING TO CHILD PROTECTION; AMENDING SECTION 16-1607, IDAHO CODE, TO PRO-
3	VIDE THAT REPORTING CHILD ABUSE, ABANDONMENT, OR NEGLECT FALSELY, IN
4	BAD FAITH, OR WITH MALICE IS A MISDEMEANOR, TO PROVIDE PENALTIES, AND TO
5	MAKE A TECHNICAL CORRECTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

- Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
- SECTION 1. That Section 16-1607, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 16-1607. REPORTING IN BAD FAITH <u>A MISDEMEANOR</u> -- CIVIL DAMAGES. Any person who makes a report or allegation of child abuse, abandonment, or neglect knowing the same to be false or who reports or alleges the same in bad faith or with malice shall be:
 - (1) Convicted of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000), confinement in the county jail for up to three (3) months, or both such fine and confinement; and
 - (2) <u>Liable liable</u> to the party or parties against whom the report was made for the amount of actual damages sustained or statutory damages of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), whichever is greater, plus attorney's fees and costs of suit. If the court finds that the defendant acted with malice or oppression, the court may award treble actual damages or treble statutory damages, whichever is greater.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and approval.
