AN ACT

1 RELATING TO EDUCATION; AMENDING SECTION 33-1004I, IDAHO CODE, AS ADDED
2 BY SECTION 1 OF SENATE BILL NO. 1110, AS ENACTED BY THE FIRST REGULAR
3 SESSION OF THE SIXTY-FIRST IDAHO LEGISLATURE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS RE-
4 LATING TO PAY FOR PERFORMANCE, HARD TO FILL POSITIONS AND LEADERSHIP
5 AWARDS; AND AMENDING SECTION 4 OF SENATE BILL NO. 1110, AS ENACTED BY
6 THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE SIXTY-FIRST IDAHO LEGISLATURE, TO RE-
7 MOVE PROVISIONS PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND TO PROVIDE PROVISIONS
8 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
9

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

11 SECTION 1. That Section 33-1004I, Idaho Code, as added by Section 1 of
12 Senate Bill No. 1110, as enacted by the First Regular Session of the Sixty-
13 first Legislature Idaho Legislature, be, and the same is hereby amended to
14 read as follows:

15 33-1004I. PAY FOR PERFORMANCE -- HARD TO FILL POSITIONS -- LEADERSHIP
16 AWARDS. (1) In addition to the moneys provided pursuant to the calculations
17 for salary-based apportionment, the following amounts shall be distributed
18 and paid, from the moneys appropriated to the educational support program,
19 subject to the criteria contained in this section:

20 (a) For fiscal year 2013, an amount equal to five hundred ~~seven~~
21 forty-four (50744) multiplied by the per statewide support unit value
22 of salary-based apportionment and discretionary funds shall be dis-
23 tributed pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

24 (b) For fiscal year 2014, an amount equal to ~~six~~ seven hundred ~~eighty~~
25 fifty-three (680753) multiplied by the per statewide support unit
26 value of salary-based apportionment and discretionary funds shall be
27 distributed pursuant to subsections (2), (3) and (4) of this section, in
28 the following proportions:

29 (i) Seventy-four and one-tenth percent (74.1%) pursuant to sub-
30 section (2) of this section;

31 (ii) Seven and four-tenths percent (7.4%) pursuant to subsection
32 (3) of this section;

33 (iii) Eighteen and one-half percent (18.5%) pursuant to subsec-
34 tion (4) of this section.

35 (c) For fiscal year 2015 and each fiscal year thereafter, an amount
36 equal to ~~six~~ seven hundred ~~eighty~~ seventy (68770) multiplied by the per
37 statewide support unit value of salary-based apportionment and discre-
38 tionary funds shall be distributed pursuant to subsections (2), (3) and
39 (4) of this section, plus fifty percent (50%) of any moneys appropriated
40 for increased pay for certificated staff beyond the amount needed to
41 fund the base and minimum instructional salaries, pursuant to section
42 33-1004E, Idaho Code, that were in effect during fiscal year 2009. Such

1 distributions made pursuant to subsections (2), (3) and (4) of this
 2 section shall be made according to the allocations established in sub-
 3 section (1) (b) of this section.

4 (d) The provision in subsection (1) (c) of this section that directs
 5 that fifty percent (50%) of certain moneys be distributed pursuant to
 6 subsections (2), (3) and (4) of this section shall be effective until
 7 such time as fifteen percent (15%) of the total moneys appropriated
 8 for certificated staff salaries are being distributed pursuant to this
 9 section. After this allocation is attained, fifteen percent (15%) of
 10 the total moneys appropriated for certificated staff salaries shall be
 11 distributed pursuant to subsections (2), (3) and (4) of this section.
 12 Such distributions made pursuant to subsections (2), (3) and (4) of this
 13 section shall be made according to the allocations established in sub-
 14 section (1) (b) of this section.

15 (e) For the purposes of this subsection, the term "statewide support
 16 units" shall mean the total number of support units calculated for the
 17 purposes of distributing salary-based apportionment in the ~~current~~
 18 previous fiscal year.

19 (f) In the event of a reduction in the moneys appropriated for certifi-
 20 cated staff salaries, the calculations established pursuant to subsec-
 21 tions (1) (b) through (d) of this section shall be performed in reverse.

22 (2) Share-based pay for performance bonuses for student achievement
 23 growth and excellence.

24 (a) Certificated employees shall be awarded state shares based on the
 25 performance of whole schools.

26 (i) Growth -- Utilizing a state longitudinal data system for
 27 students, the state department of education shall develop a sys-
 28 tem for measuring individual student growth. Such system shall
 29 compare spring student scores on the state-mandated summative
 30 achievement tests ("spring test") from one year to the next, and
 31 establish percentile rankings for individual student growth by
 32 comparing students with an identical spring test score in the pre-
 33 vious year with each other in the current year. A separate growth
 34 percentile shall be established for each student for each subject
 35 in which the spring test is given in consecutive grades. The me-
 36 dian student growth percentile, based on measuring all eligible
 37 students, shall be the growth score for each school. All certifi-
 38 cated employees at a school with a median growth score in the fol-
 39 lowing ranked quartiles shall be awarded state shares as follows:

45 (ii) Excellence -- The state department of education shall de-
 46 velop a system for comparing and ranking school spring test scores
 47 based on standardized scores, utilizing all grades and subjects
 48 tested. Based on each school's median standardized score, all

1 certificated employees of a school in the following ranked quar-
2 tiles shall be awarded state shares as follows:

8 (iii) No certificated instructional employee shall receive more
9 than one (1.00) share, the results of the quartile award tables
10 for growth and excellence notwithstanding. No certificated ad-
11 ministrative employee shall receive more than two (2.00) shares,
12 the results of the quartile award tables for growth and excellence
13 notwithstanding.

14 (iv) Students whose spring test results are excluded from the
15 school's results for federal accountability purposes shall be ex-
16 cluded from school growth and excellence calculations.

17 (v) For schools that do not administer the spring test, or for
18 which no spring test growth calculation is possible, the school
19 and its certificated employees shall be included with the school
20 to which the students matriculate.

21 (vi) For certificated employees assigned more than one (1)
22 school, state shares shall be earned pro rata, based on the per-
23 centage of the employee's time assigned to each school at the time
24 that students take their spring tests. In addition, for part-time
25 employees, state shares shall be earned pro rata, based on such
26 employee's full-time equivalency status.

27 (vii) The number of schools in each quartile shall be based on
28 the number of certificated employees employed at the schools, with
29 as close to twenty-five percent (25%) of such employees falling
30 within each quartile as possible.

31 (viii) For certificated employees not assigned to a specific
32 school, all new employment contracts signed on or after July 1,
33 2011, shall provide that at least five percent (5%) of the total
34 available compensation be based on growth in student achievement,
35 as determined by the board of trustees. Such percentage shall
36 increase to ten percent (10%) of the total available compensation
37 for contracts signed on or after July 1, 2015, and fifteen percent
38 (15%) for contracts signed on or after July 1, 2019.

39 (b) Local shares shall be awarded to certificated employees based on
40 performance. Each board of trustees shall develop a plan for awarding
41 local pay for performance shares in consultation with certificated em-
42 ployees. Local share awards to certificated instructional employees
43 shall be based on the performance of groups of such employees, unless
44 there is only one (1) such employee in the school district. No employee
45 shall receive more than one (1.00) local share. For part-time employ-
46 ees, local shares shall be earned pro rata, based on such employee's
47 full-time equivalency status. Local share awards shall be based on one
48 (1) or more of the following measures:

- 1 (i) Student test scores;
- 2 (ii) Student graduation rate;
- 3 (iii) Student dropout rate;
- 4 (iv) Percent of graduates attending postsecondary education or
- 5 entering military service;
- 6 (v) Making federally approved adequate yearly progress;
- 7 (vi) Number of students successfully completing dual credit or
- 8 advanced placement classes;
- 9 (vii) Percent of students involved in extracurricular activi-
- 10 ties;
- 11 (viii) Class projects;
- 12 (ix) Portfolios;
- 13 (x) Successful completion of special student assignments;
- 14 (xi) Parental involvement;
- 15 (xii) Teacher-assigned grades; and
- 16 (xiii) Student attendance rate; and
- 17 (xiv) Various other criteria determined by local districts, sub-
- 18 ject to approval by the state department of education.

19 For any school district in which the board of trustees fails to adopt a
 20 plan for awarding local pay for performance shares by September 1, local
 21 shares awarded for performance in that school year shall be identical to
 22 the number of state shares awarded for each certificated employee.

23 (c) Individual pay for performance bonuses shall be calculated as fol-
 24 lows:

- 25 (i) Divide the moneys available for pay for performance bonuses
- 26 by the total number of state shares earned by certificated employ-
- 27 ees statewide.
- 28 (ii) To determine the amount of pay for performance bonus funds
- 29 to distribute to each school district, multiply the result of
- 30 subparagraph (i) of this subsection by the number of state shares
- 31 earned by certificated employees in the school district.
- 32 (iii) To establish the value of a share in each school district,
- 33 the school district shall divide the funds distributed by the
- 34 state department of education pursuant to subparagraph (ii) of
- 35 this subsection by the total number of state and local shares
- 36 earned by all certificated employees who earned at least a frac-
- 37 tion of both a state and local share.
- 38 (iv) Multiply the total number of state and local shares earned
- 39 by each certificated employee of the school district who earned at
- 40 least a fraction of a state and local share by the result of sub-
- 41 paragraph (iii) of this subsection. Certificated employees who do
- 42 not earn at least a fraction of both a state and local share shall
- 43 not be eligible to receive a pay for performance bonus. Pay for
- 44 performance bonuses shall be paid by school districts to qualify-
- 45 ing certificated employees in a lump sum by no later than December
- 46 15 following the spring test of the prior school year.

47 (3) Hard to fill position bonuses.

48 (a) The state board of education shall designate certificates and en-
 49 dorsements held by certificated instructional staff for hard to fill
 50 position bonuses. The board shall rank the certificates or endorse-

1 ments to be so designated based on the relative difficulty of school
2 districts' ability to recruit and retain such personnel. No additional
3 certificates or endorsements may be added to the rankings beyond the
4 first such certificate or endorsement that causes the number of cer-
5 tificates or endorsements to equal or exceed one-third (1/3) of the
6 total certificates and endorsements held by certificated instructional
7 public school employees in the state. The board shall review and alter
8 such rankings and designations at least once every two (2) years based
9 on market conditions. Any changes in rankings and designations shall be
10 made by the board by no later than March 31 of the previous school year,
11 and school districts shall be promptly notified of any changes.

12 (b) School district boards of trustees may choose to designate certifi-
13 cates and endorsements held by certificated instructional employees
14 for hard to fill position bonuses, provided such certificates and en-
15 dorsements have been so designated by the state board of education
16 as provided in subsection (3)(a) of this section. School boards of
17 trustees choosing to make such designations shall rank the certificates
18 and endorsements based on the relative difficulty of recruiting and re-
19 taining such personnel. No additional certificates or endorsements may
20 be added to the rankings beyond the first such certificate or endorse-
21 ment that causes the number of the district's full-time equivalent em-
22 ployees utilizing such certificates and endorsements to equal or exceed
23 ten percent (10%) of the certificated instructional positions employed
24 by the district; provided however, the number of such employees who may
25 be designated shall not be less than one (1). The amount distributed
26 for utilization by each district shall be based on each district's share
27 of the total certificated instructional employees statewide. Funds so
28 distributed shall be paid solely to certificated instructional person-
29 nel holding the certifications and endorsements designated by the local
30 school board, in amounts that shall be determined at the discretion of
31 the local board, which may vary between, but not within, individual cer-
32 tificate and endorsement areas; provided however, no award shall exceed
33 twice the statewide average bonus paid per certificated instructional
34 employee pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

35 (c) School districts may apply to the state board of education to waive
36 the requirement that a certificate or endorsement designated by the
37 school district for hard to fill position bonuses first be designated
38 for such by the state board of education. The state board of education
39 may grant such a waiver for good and rational cause.

40 (d) In order to receive a hard to fill position bonus, an individual
41 must actually be providing instruction or service within the designated
42 certificate or endorsement area.

43 (e) If an individual qualifies for a hard to fill position bonus in more
44 than one (1) certificate or endorsement, the individual shall be allo-
45 cated and paid on a full-time equivalency basis, based on the relative
46 time spent in each of the qualifying areas.

47 (f) School district boards of trustees choosing to utilize hard to fill
48 position bonus funds shall designate a new list of certificates and en-
49 dorsements for such bonuses for each school year by no later than June 11
50 of the previous school year. The new list may be identical to the list

1 from the previous school year, subject to the current ten percent (10%)
2 limitation requirements.

3 (g) If the board of trustees determines that it will be unable to at-
4 tract a qualified candidate to serve in a hard to fill position, even
5 with the addition of such bonus funds, the board may use such funds
6 to pay for the training and coursework needed by a currently unquali-
7 fied employee or other individual to gain such qualification. If such
8 payment is authorized, the amount paid for an individual in a fiscal
9 year shall not exceed twice the statewide average bonus paid per cer-
10 tificated instructional employee pursuant to subsection (2) of this
11 section. The individual for whom training and coursework is paid in
12 such manner must earn a passing grade for the training and coursework
13 that is paid by the school district and must work for the school district
14 at least one (1) year in the designated certificate or endorsement area
15 for each fiscal year in which the school district made payments for
16 training and coursework, or repay the funds.

17 (h) Hard to fill position bonuses shall be paid by school districts to
18 qualifying certificated instructional employees by no later than De-
19 cember 15, in a lump sum payment.

20 (4) Leadership awards.

21 (a) School district boards of trustees may designate up to twenty-five
22 percent (25%) of their certificated instructional employees for lead-
23 ership awards. Such awards shall recognize excellence, be valid only
24 for the fiscal year for which the awards are made and require one (1) or
25 more of the following additional duties:

- 26 (i) Teacher or other instructional staff mentoring;
- 27 (ii) Content leadership;
- 28 (iii) Lead teacher;
- 29 (iv) Peer teaching coach;
- 30 (v) Content specialist;
- 31 (vi) Remedial instructor;
- 32 (vii) Curriculum development;
- 33 (viii) Assessment development;
- 34 (ix) Data analysis;
- 35 (x) Grant writing;
- 36 (xi) Special program coordinator;
- 37 (xii) Research project;
- 38 (xiii) Teaching professional development course;
- 39 (xiv) Service on local/state/national education committee or
40 task force;
- 41 (xv) Providing leadership to a professional learning community;
- 42 and
- 43 (xvi) Earning national board certification; and
- 44 (xvii) Various other criteria determined by local districts, sub-
45 ject to approval by the state department of education.

46 Duties related to student activities and athletics shall not be eligi-
47 ble for leadership awards.

48 (b) Local school district boards of trustees shall require that the em-
49 ployee work additional time as a condition of the receipt of a leader-
50 ship award.

1 (c) Local school district boards of trustees may grant multiple lead-
2 ership awards with multiple additional duties. No employee, however,
3 shall receive leadership awards in excess of twice the statewide aver-
4 age bonus paid per certificated instructional employee pursuant to sub-
5 section (2) of this section.

6 (d) Leadership awards shall be paid by school districts to qualifying
7 certificated instructional employees in a lump sum payment upon comple-
8 tion of the additional duty.

9 (e) Employees with fewer than three (3) years of experience shall not be
10 eligible for leadership awards. The term "experience" shall be as used
11 for certificated instructional staff in section 33-1004A, Idaho Code.

12 (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (4) (a) through (e) of
13 this section, employees who earned national board certification prior
14 to July 1, 2011, and who are no longer receiving payments for earning
15 such certification pursuant to section 33-1004E, Idaho Code, due to the
16 repeal of the provision providing for such payments, shall be paid two
17 thousand dollars (\$2,000) per year from the moneys allocated pursuant
18 to this subsection (4) until all moneys that would have been paid un-
19 der the previous provisions of section 33-1004E, Idaho Code, have been
20 paid.

21 (5) School districts may shift moneys between the allocations for
22 subsections (3) and (4) of this section. The ten percent (10%) limitation
23 established in subsection (3) of this section and the twenty-five percent
24 (25%) limitation established in subsection (4) of this section shall be ad-
25 justed accordingly.

26 (6) All distributions of moneys to school districts shall be made as
27 part of the third payment to school districts required by section 33-1009,
28 Idaho Code.

29 (7) School districts shall not enter into any contract that discrimi-
30 nates against those receiving a bonus award pursuant to this section.

31 (8) The state department of education may require reports of informa-
32 tion as needed to implement the provisions of this section and provide re-
33 ports to the governor, the legislature and the public.

34 (9) For the purposes of this section, the term "school district" also
35 means "public charter school," and the term "board of trustees" also means
36 "board of directors."

37 SECTION 2. That Section 4 of Senate Bill No. 1110, as enacted by the
38 First Regular Session of the Sixty-first Idaho Legislature, be, and the same
39 is hereby amended to read as follows:

40 SECTION 4. Sections 1, 2 and 3 of this act shall be in full force and ef-
41 fect on and after July 1, 2012. An emergency existing therefor, which emer-
42 gency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect
43 on and after its passage and approval.

44 SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby
45 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its
46 passage and approval.
