RELATING TO TRANSPARENT AND ETHICAL GOVERNMENT; AMENDING TITLE 74, IDAHC
CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW CHAPTER 7, TITLE 74, IDAHO CODE, TO
PROVIDE LEGISLATIVE INTENT AND TO PROVIDE FOR REPORTING OF PAID LEG-
ISLATIVE TRAVEL AND A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING
AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\text{NEW CHAPTER}}$, to be known and designated as Chapter 7, Title 74, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

CHAPTER 7 TRANSPARENCY IN LEGISLATIVE TRAVEL

74-701. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the legislature to promote public confidence in government and to promote transparency by requiring legislators, legislators-elect, and candidates for legislative office to report travel paid for by others.

SECTION 1. That Title 74, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended

- 74-702. REPORTING OF PAID TRAVEL -- PENALTY. (1) All legislative officials shall report to the secretary of state all travel outside of Idaho reasonably related to a legislative or governmental purpose or to an issue of state, national, or international public policy paid for by another individual or entity. Travel paid through campaign funds that are reported pursuant to chapter 66, title 67, Idaho Code, or solely through personal funds of a legislative official shall not be subject to the requirements of this section. For the purposes of this section, "legislative official" means a legislative candidate who will appear on a general election ballot, a member of the Idaho legislature, and a member-elect of the Idaho legislature who has prevailed in a general election but has not yet received the oath of office.
- (2) Within thirty (30) days of the return date of any travel subject to the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, a legislative official who is subject to the reporting requirements provided for in subsection (1) of this section shall file a report with the secretary of state that includes:
 - (a) The travel destination;
 - (b) The dates of travel;
 - (c) The purpose of the travel; and
 - (d) The name and address of the person or entity that paid for the travel, including whether the travel was a campaign contribution and, in the case of current members of the legislature, whether the travel was made in such member's official capacity as a legislator.
- (3) Any legislative official who fails to file the report required pursuant to subsection (2) of this section within thirty (30) days shall be sub-

- ject to a late fee in the amount of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) each day until the report is filed, which fee shall be deposited in the public school income fund.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2025.
