- RELATING TO THE STATE RAIL AND INTERMODAL FACILITY SYSTEM PLAN; AMENDING 2 SECTION 49-2905, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE DUTIES OF THE TRANSPORTATION DE-3 PARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE REGARDING THE STATE RAIL AND 4 5 INTERMODAL FACILITY SYSTEM PLAN.
- Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho: 6

SECTION 1. That Section 49-2905, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 7 amended to read as follows: 8

49-2905. STATE RAIL AND INTERMODAL FACILITY SYSTEM PLAN. (1) The Idaho 9 transportation department shall prepare and periodically update a state 10 rail and intermodal facility system plan, a primary objective of which is to 11 identify, evaluate and encourage the development and preservation of essen-12 13 tial rail and truck intermodal services. The plan shall: 14

- (a) Identify and describe the state's rail system;
- (b) Prepare state rail system maps;

- (d) Identify and evaluate rail access and congestion issues; 18
 - (e) Identify and evaluate rail commodity flows and traffic types;
- Identify lines and corridors that have been rail banked or pre-20 (f) 21 served;
- 22 Identify and evaluate other rail and intermodal issues affect-(q) 23 ing the state's freight transportation system and regional and local 24 economies;
- (h) Identify and evaluate those rail freight lines that are potentially 25 subject to abandonment in the future because of unmet capital needs or 26 other reasons, or have recently been approved for abandonment but the 27 track improvements are still in place; 28
- (i) Whenever possible provide priorities for determining which rail 29 lines or intermodal commerce authorities should receive state support, 30 and provide to the interagency working group supporting information 31 used in establishing such priorities for use by the interagency working 32 group in advising the department of agriculture. The priorities should 33 include: 34
- (i) The anticipated benefits to the state and local economy; 35 (ii) Coordinated freight transportation system including the an-36 37
- ticipated cost of road and highway improvements necessitated by the proposed project; 38 39 (iii) Establishment of an intermodal facility, if indicated;
- (iv) The likelihood the qualified line receiving funding can meet 40 operating costs from freight charges, surcharges on rail traffic 41 and other funds; and 42

The impact of abandonment or capacity constraints if the 1 (V) 2 project does not obtain state support; and (j) Identify and describe the state's intermodal rural rail and truck 3 freight system by: 4 (i) Preparing state intermodal and regional freight transfer 5 station system maps; 6 (ii) Identifying and evaluating intermodal and truck and rail 7 freight transfer capacity and coordination issues in cooperation 8 with local government and the railroad and truck interests; 9 (iii) Identifying and evaluating intermodal and freight transfer 10 access and highway capacity issues; and 11 (iv) Identifying and evaluating major freight commodity origins, 12 destinations and traffic flows by mode and corridor. 13 The Idaho transportation department shall provide information to (2)14 the interagency working group for assisting and advising the department 15 16 of agriculture to monitor the status of the state's mainline, short line and branch line common carrier railroads through the state rail planning 17 process and various analyses. In addition, the Idaho transportation de-18 partment shall submit to the interagency working group, its evaluation of 19 alternatives to abandonment prior to federal surface transportation board 20 21 proceedings, where feasible. (3) The state rail and intermodal facility system plan may be prepared 22 23 in conjunction with any rail plan currently prepared by the Idaho transportation department pursuant to other federal rail assistance programs, 24 or which may be enacted, including if applicable, the federal local rail 25 freight assistance program. 26 27 (4) The Idaho transportation department shall determine the amount of moneys necessary to prepare and periodically update the state rail plan re-28 quired by subsection (1) of this section, and communicate that amount to the 29 department of agriculture who shall annually provide to the transportation 30 department moneys in an amount not to exceed one percent (1%) of the total as-31 sets in the fund established by section 49-2904, Idaho Code, to prepare and 32 periodically update the state rail plan. The Idaho transportation depart-33 ment is hereby authorized to accumulate these funds not to exceed an aggre-34 gate amount of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for preparing and pe-35 riodically updating the state rail plan. 36
