RELATING TO INCOME TAXES; AMENDING SECTION 63-3004, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE 2 FOR APPLICABILITY OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE TO DIFFERENT TAX YEARS; 3 AMENDING SECTION 63-3021, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE THE CALCULATION OF A 4 5 NET OPERATING LOSS; AMENDING SECTION 63-3022, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE THE CALCULATION OF IDAHO TAXABLE INCOME FOR CORPORATIONS AND TO REMOVE 6 OBSOLETE LANGUAGE; AMENDING SECTION 63-3024, IDAHO CODE, TO REDUCE THE 7 INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX RATE; AMENDING SECTION 63-3025, IDAHO CODE, TO 8 REDUCE THE CORPORATE INCOME TAX RATE; AMENDING CHAPTER 30, TITLE 63, 9 IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 63-3029L, IDAHO CODE, TO 10 PROVIDE FOR A CHILD TAX CREDIT; AMENDING SECTION 33-5401, IDAHO CODE, 11 TO REVISE A DEFINITION AND TO PROVIDE A CORRECT TAX CODE CITATION; AND 12 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING RETROACTIVE APPLICATION. 13

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15 SECTION 1. That Section 63-3004, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 16 amended to read as follows:

63-3004. INTERNAL REVENUE CODE. (a) The term "Internal Revenue Code"
means, for taxable years beginning on any day of 2017, the Internal Revenue
Code of 1986 of the United States, as amended, and in effect on the first
twenty-first day of January December 2017, except that Internal Revenue Code
sections 965 and 213 are applied as in effect on December 31, 2017.

(b) Provisions of the Internal Revenue Code amended, deleted, or added
prior to the effective date of the latest amendment to this section shall be
applicable for Idaho income tax purposes on the effective date provided for
such amendments, deletions, or additions, including retroactive provisions
The term "Internal Revenue Code" means, for taxable years beginning on or
after the first day of January 2018, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
amended, and in effect on the first day of January 2018.

(c) For all purposes of the Idaho income tax act, a marriage must be one
 that is considered valid or recognized under section 28, article III, of the
 constitution of the state of Idaho and defined in section 32-201, Idaho Code,
 or as recognized under section 32-209, Idaho Code.

(d) Notwithstanding subsection (c) of this section, marriages recog nized and permitted by the United States supreme court and the ninth circuit
 court of appeals shall also be recognized for purposes of the Idaho income
 tax act.

37 SECTION 2. That Section 63-3021, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 38 amended to read as follows:

63-3021. NET OPERATING LOSS. (a) The term "net operating loss" means 1 2 the amount by which Idaho taxable income, after making the modifications specified in subsection (b) of this section, is less than zero (0). 3 (b) Add the following amounts: 4 (1)The amount of any net operating loss deduction included in Idaho 5 taxable income. 6 (2) In the case of a taxpayer other than a corporation: 7 Any amount deducted due to losses in excess of gains from (i) 8 sales or exchanges of capital assets; and 9 (ii) Any deduction for long-term capital gains provided by this 10 chapter. 11 (3) Any deduction allowed under section 151 of the Internal Revenue 12 Code (relating to personal exemption) or any deduction in lieu of any 13 such deduction. 14 (4) Any deduction for the standard or itemized deductions provided for 15 16 in section 63 of the Internal Revenue Code, or section 63-3022(j), Idaho Code, except for any deduction allowable under section 165(c)(3) of the 17 Internal Revenue Code (relating to casualty losses) pertaining to prop-18 erty physically located inside Idaho at the time of the casualty. 19 (5) Any amount limited by section 461 of the Internal Revenue Code. 20 21 (c) Subject to the provisions of sections 381 and 382, Internal Revenue Code, Idaho net operating losses incurred by a corporation will survive 22 23 a merger. (1) Changes in the location of a loss corporation's business or its key 24 employees shall not be treated as a failure to satisfy the continuity of 25 26 business requirements. (2) If the premerger corporation conducted operations in Idaho and at 27 least one (1) other state, the section 382, Internal Revenue Code, loss 28 limitation is limited further by the premerger loss corporation's Idaho 29 apportionment factor for the last taxable year preceding the date of the 30 merger. 31 SECTION 3. That Section 63-3022, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 32 amended to read as follows: 33 ADJUSTMENTS TO TAXABLE INCOME. The additions and subtrac-34 63-3022. 35 tions set forth in this section, and in sections 63-3022A through 63-3022U, Idaho Code, are to be applied to the extent allowed in computing Idaho tax-36 37 able income: (a) Add any state and local taxes, as defined in section 164 of the In-38 ternal Revenue Code that are measured by net income, or for which a credit is 39 allowable under section 63-3029, Idaho Code, and paid or accrued during the 40 taxable year adjusted for state or local tax refunds used in arriving at tax-41 42 able income. (b) Add the net operating loss deduction used in arriving at taxable in-43 44 come. (c) (1) A net operating loss for any taxable year commencing on and af-45 ter January 1, 2000, but before January 1, 2013, shall be a net oper-46 47 ating loss carryback not to exceed a total of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to the two (2) immediately preceding taxable years. At 48 49 the election of the taxpayer, the two (2) year carryback may be forgone

and the loss subtracted from income received in taxable years arising in 1 2 the next twenty (20) years succeeding the taxable year in which the loss arises in order until exhausted. The election shall be made as under 3 section 172(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. An election under this 4 subsection must be in the manner prescribed in the rules of the state tax 5 commission and once made is irrevocable for the year in which it is made. 6 (2) A net operating loss for any taxable year commencing on or after 7 January 1, 2013, shall be a net operating loss carryback not to exceed 8 a total of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to the two (2) imme-9 diately preceding taxable years only if an amended return carrying the 10 loss back is filed within one (1) year of the end of the taxable year of 11 the net operating loss that results in such carryback. 12

(3) Any portion of the net operating loss not subtracted from income in 13 the two (2) preceding years may be subtracted from income in the next 14 twenty (20) years succeeding the taxable year in which the loss arises 15 16 in order until exhausted. The sum of the deductions may not exceed the amount of the net operating loss deduction incurred. The carryback 17 shall be limited to a total of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in the 18 case of an individual filing as married filing separate in the year of 19 20 the loss.

21 (4) Net operating losses incurred by a corporation during a year in which such corporation did not transact business in Idaho or was not 22 included in a group of corporations combined under subsection (t) of 23 section 63-3027, Idaho Code, may not be subtracted. However, if at 24 least one (1) corporation within a group of corporations combined under 25 subsection (t) of section 63-3027, Idaho Code, was transacting business 26 in Idaho during the taxable year in which the loss was incurred, then the 27 net operating loss may be subtracted. Net operating losses incurred by 28 a person, other than a corporation, in activities not taxable by Idaho 29 may not be subtracted. 30

(5) The term "income" as used in this subsection means Idaho taxable in come as defined in this chapter as modified by section 63-3021(b)(2),
 (3) and (4), Idaho Code.

(d) In the case of a corporation, add the amount deducted under the provisions of sections 243(a) and (c), 244, 245 and, 245A, 246A, 250 and 965 of
the Internal Revenue Code (relating to dividends received by corporations
and other special deductions) as limited by section 246(b) (1) of said code.

(e) In the case of a corporation, subtract an amount determined undersection 78 of the Internal Revenue Code to be taxable as dividends.

(f) Subtract the amount of any income received or accrued during the
taxable year which is exempt from taxation by this state, under the provisions of any other law of this state or a law of the United States, if not previously subtracted in arriving at taxable income.

(g) For the purpose of determining the Idaho taxable income of the bene-ficiary of a trust or of an estate:

46 (1) Distributable net income as defined for federal tax purposes shall
47 be corrected for the other adjustments required by this section.

48 (2) Net operating losses attributable to a beneficiary of a trust or es 49 tate under section 642 of the Internal Revenue Code shall be a deduction
 50 for the beneficiary to the extent that income from the trust or estate

would be attributable to this state under the provisions of this chapter.

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(h) In the case of an individual who is on active duty as a full-time officer, enlistee or draftee, with the armed forces of the United States, which full-time duty is or will be continuous and uninterrupted for one hundred twenty (120) consecutive days or more, deduct compensation paid by the armed forces of the United States for services performed outside this state. The deduction is allowed only to the extent such income is included in taxable income.

10 (i) In the case of a corporation, including any corporation included 11 in a group of corporations combined under subsection (t) of section 63-3027, Idaho Code, add any capital loss or passive loss deducted which loss was in-12 curred during any year in which such corporation did not transact business in 13 Idaho. However, do not add any capital loss deducted if a corporation, in-14 cluding any corporation in a group of corporations combined under subsection 15 16 (t) of section 63-3027, Idaho Code, was transacting business in Idaho during the taxable year in which the loss was incurred. In the case of persons 17 other than corporations, add any capital loss or passive loss deducted which 18 was incurred in activities not taxable by Idaho at the time such loss was in-19 curred. In computing the income taxable to an S corporation or partnership 20 21 under this section, deduction shall not be allowed for a carryover or carryback of a net operating loss provided for in subsection (c) of this section, 22 a passive loss or a capital loss provided for in section 1212 of the Internal 23 Revenue Code. 24

(j) In the case of an individual, there shall be allowed as a deduction
from gross income either paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection at the option of the taxpayer:

(1) The standard deduction as defined in section 63 of the Internal Rev enue Code.

30 (2) Itemized deductions as defined in section 63 of the Internal Rev 31 enue Code except state or local taxes measured by net income and general
 32 sales taxes as either is defined in section 164 of the Internal Revenue
 33 Code.

(k) Add the taxable amount of any lump sum distribution excluded from
 gross income for federal income tax purposes under the ten (10) year averag ing method. The taxable amount will include the ordinary income portion and
 the amount eligible for the capital gain election.

(1) Deduct any amounts included in gross income under the provisions of
 section 86 of the Internal Revenue Code relating to certain social security
 and railroad benefits.

(m) In the case of a self-employed individual, deduct the actual cost
of premiums paid to secure worker's compensation insurance for coverage in
Idaho, if such cost has not been deducted in arriving at taxable income.

(n) In the case of an individual for any tax period ending on or prior
to December 31, 2016, deduct the amount contributed to a college savings program but not more than four thousand dollars (\$4,000) per tax year. In the
case of an individual and for any tax period starting on or after January 1,
2017, deduct the amount contributed to a college savings program, but not
more than six thousand dollars (\$6,000) per tax year. For those married and
filing jointly, deduct the amount contributed to a college savings program,

but not more than twice of that allowed for an individual. To be qualified for this deduction, the contribution must be made during the taxable year and made to an Idaho college savings program account as described in chapter 54, title 33, Idaho Code.

5 (o) In the case of an individual, add the amount of a nonqualified with-6 drawal from an individual trust account or savings account established pur-7 suant to chapter 54, title 33, Idaho Code, less any amount of such nonqual-8 ified withdrawal included in the individual's federal gross income pursuant 9 to section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code.

(p) In the case of an individual, add the amount of a withdrawal from an 10 11 individual trust account or savings account established pursuant to chapter 54, title 33, Idaho Code, transferred to a qualified tuition program, as de-12 fined in section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code, that is operated by a state 13 other than Idaho. The addition provided in this subsection is limited to the 14 amount of the contributions to the Idaho individual trust account or savings 15 16 account by the account owner that was deducted on the account owner's income tax return for the year of the transfer and the prior taxable year. 17

18 SECTION 4. That Section 63-3024, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 19 amended to read as follows:

63-3024. INDIVIDUALS' TAX AND TAX ON ESTATES AND TRUSTS. For taxable
 year 2001, and each taxable year thereafter, a tax measured by Idaho taxable
 income as defined in this chapter is hereby imposed upon every individual,
 trust, or estate required by this chapter to file a return.

(a) The tax imposed upon individuals, trusts and estates shall be computed at the following rates:

For taxable year 2000 and each year thereafter, the state tax commission 10 shall prescribe a factor which shall be used to compute the Idaho income tax 11 brackets provided in subsection (a) of this section. The factor shall pro-12 13 vide an adjustment to the Idaho tax brackets so that inflation will not result in a tax increase. The Idaho tax brackets shall be adjusted as follows: 14 15 multiply the bracket amounts by the percentage (the consumer price index for the calendar year immediately preceding the calendar year to which the ad-16 justed brackets will apply divided by the consumer price index for calendar 17 year 1998). For the purpose of this computation, the consumer price index 18 for any calendar year is the average of the consumer price index as of the 19 20 close of the twelve (12) month period for the immediately preceding calendar year, without regard to any subsequent adjustments, as adopted by the state 21 tax commission. This adoption shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter 22 52, title 67, Idaho Code. The consumer price index shall mean the consumer 23 price index for all U.S. urban consumers published by the United States de-24 25 partment of labor. The state tax commission shall annually include the factor as provided in this subsection to multiply against Idaho taxable income 26 in the brackets above to arrive at that year's Idaho taxable income for tax 27 28 bracket purposes.

29 (b) In case a joint return is filed by husband and wife pursuant to the provisions of section 63-3031, Idaho Code, the tax imposed by this section 30 shall be twice the tax which would be imposed on one-half (1/2) of the aggre-31 gate Idaho taxable income. For the purposes of this section, a return of a 32 surviving spouse, as defined in section 2(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, 33 34 and a head of household, as defined in section 2(b) of the Internal Revenue 35 Code, shall be treated as a joint return and the tax imposed shall be twice the tax which would be imposed on one-half (1/2) of the Idaho taxable income. 36

(c) In the case of a trust that is an electing small business trust as
defined in section 1361 of the Internal Revenue Code, the special rules for
taxation of such trusts contained in section 641 of the Internal Revenue Code
shall apply except that the maximum individual rate provided in this section
shall apply in computing tax due under this chapter.

(d) The state tax commission shall compute and publish Idaho income
tax liability for taxpayers at the midpoint of each bracket of Idaho taxable
income in fifty dollar (\$50.00) steps to fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000),
rounding such calculations to the nearest dollar. Taxpayers having income
within such brackets shall file returns based upon and pay taxes according
to the schedule thus established. The state tax commission shall promulgate
rules defining the conditions upon which such returns shall be filed.

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1 SECTION 5. That Section 63-3025, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 2 amended to read as follows:

63-3025. TAX ON CORPORATE INCOME. (1) For taxable years commencing on
and after January 1, 2001, a tax is hereby imposed on the Idaho taxable income
of a corporation, other than an S corporation, which transacts or is authorized to transact business in this state or which has income attributable to
this state. The tax shall be equal to seven six and four-tenths nine hundred
twenty-five thousandths percent (7.46.925%) of Idaho taxable income.

9 (2) In the case of an S corporation that is required to file a return un10 der section 63-3030, Idaho Code, a tax is hereby imposed at the rate provided
11 in subsection (1) of this section upon both:

(a) Net recognized built-in gain attributable to this state. The
amount of net recognized built-in gain attributable to this state shall
be computed in accordance with section 1374 of the Internal Revenue
Code subject to the apportionment and allocation provisions of section
63-3027, Idaho Code.

(b) Excess net passive income attributable to this state. The amount of
excess net passive income attributable to this state shall be computed
in accordance with section 1375 of the Internal Revenue Code subject to
the apportionment and allocation provisions of section 63-3027, Idaho
Code.

(3) The tax imposed by subsection (1) or (2) of this section shall not
be less than twenty dollars (\$20.00); provided further that the twenty dollar (\$20.00) minimum payment shall not be collected from nonproductive mining corporations.

(4) The tax imposed by this section shall not apply to corporations
taxed pursuant to the provisions of section 63-3025A, Idaho Code.

28 SECTION 6. That Chapter 30, Title 63, Idaho Code, be, and the same is
 29 hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and des 30 ignated as Section 63-3029L, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

CHILD TAX CREDIT. (1) For taxable years beginning on or af-31 63-3029L. ter January 1, 2018, and before January 1, 2026, there shall be allowed to a 32 taxpayer a nonrefundable credit against the tax imposed by this chapter in 33 the amount of one hundred thirty dollars (\$130) with respect to each quali-34 fying child of the taxpayer. For purposes of this section, the term "qual-35 ifying child" has the meaning as defined in section 24(c) of the Internal 36 Revenue Code. In no event shall more than one (1) taxpayer be allowed this 37 credit for the same qualifying child. 38

(2) In the case of divorced parents or parents who do not live together, if the qualifying child is in the custody of one (1) or both of the child's parents for more than one-half of a calendar year, such child is the qualifying child of the custodial parent for the taxable year beginning during such calendar year. However, the child may be the qualifying child of the noncustodial parent if either of the following requirements are met:

(a) A court of competent jurisdiction has unconditionally awarded, in
writing, the noncustodial parent the tax credit authorized under this
section and the noncustodial parent attaches a copy of the court order
to the noncustodial parent's income tax return for the taxable year; or

(b) The custodial parent signs a written declaration that such custodial parent will not claim the credit of this section with respect to
such child for any taxable year beginning in such calendar year and the
noncustodial parent attaches such written declaration to the noncustodial parent's income tax return for the taxable year beginning during
such calendar year.

7 SECTION 7. That Section 33-5401, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 8 amended to read as follows:

9 33-5401. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter, the following terms
10 have the following meanings unless the context clearly denotes otherwise:

(1) "Account" means an individual trust account or savings account established as prescribed in this chapter.

(2) "Account owner" means the person or state or local government or ganization designated in the agreement governing the account as having the
 right to withdraw moneys from the account before the account is disbursed to
 or for the benefit of the designated beneficiary.

(3) "Board" means the state college savings program board created insection 33-5402, Idaho Code.

(4) "Designated beneficiary," except as provided in section 33-5404,
Idaho Code, means, with respect to an account, the individual designated at
the time the account is opened as the individual whose higher education expenses are expected to be paid from the account or, if this designated beneficiary is replaced in accordance with section 33-5404, Idaho Code, the replacement beneficiary.

(5) "Eligible educational institution" shall have the meaning providedin 26 U.S.C. section 529.

(6) "Financial institution" means any state bank, national bank, savings bank, savings and loan association, credit union, insurance company,
brokerage firm, trust company, mutual fund, investment firm or other similar
entity that is authorized to do business in this state.

31 (7) "Member of the family" shall have the meaning as provided in 2632 U.S.C. section 529.

(8) "Nonqualified withdrawal" means an account withdrawal that is notone (1) of the following:

(a) A qualified withdrawal;

36 (b) A withdrawal made as the result of the death or disability of the37 designated beneficiary of an account;

(c) A withdrawal that is made on account of a scholarship as defined
 in 26 U.S.C. section 117 or an educational allowance as defined in 26
 U.S.C. section 25A(g)(2);

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(d) A rollover or change of the designated beneficiary.

42 (9) "Person" means an individual, a trust, an estate, a partnership,
43 an association, a foundation, a guardianship, a corporation, or a custodian
44 under the Idaho uniform transfers to minors act.

(10) "Program" means the one (1) or more college savings program
 programs established under this chapter.

47 (11) "Qualified higher education expenses" shall have the meaning pro48 vided in 26 U.S.C. section 529(e) (3).

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(12) "Qualified withdrawal" means a withdrawal from an account to pay
 the qualified higher education expenses of the designated beneficiary of the
 account, but only if the withdrawal is made in accordance with this chapter.

SECTION 8. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby
declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its
passage and approval, and retroactively to January 1, 2018.
