5	TO PROVIDE FOR PATIENT VISITATION RIGHTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
5	AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Title 39, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW CHAPTER</u>, to be known and designated as Chapter 97, Title 39, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

## 11 CHAPTER 97 12 PATIENT VISITATION RIGHTS ACT

39-9701. SHORT TITLE. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Patient Visitation Rights Act."

39-9702. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the policy of this state that the preservation of relationships between patients and family members and associates is a priority considered essential to the preservation of the health and well-being of individuals and that a patient's need for visitation is a right that shall not be superseded by other government objectives.

39-9703. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Care facility" means a hospice house, hospital, or nursing facility.
- (2) "Hospice house" shall have the meaning provided for in section 39-1301(j), Idaho Code.
- (3) "Hospital" shall have the meaning provided for in section 39-1301(a), Idaho Code.
- (4) "Normal visitation policy" means the visitation policy that was in effect at a facility on January 1, 2020.
- (5) "Nursing facility" shall have the meaning provided for in section 39-1301(b), Idaho Code.
- 39-9704. PATIENT VISITATION RIGHTS. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of law or rule to the contrary, a care facility shall not restrict a patient's right to in-person visitation, subject to the guidelines, conditions, and limitations of the care facility's normal visitation policy. The in-person visitation rights specified in this section may not be made more restrictive or terminated, suspended, or waived by a care facility, the department of health and welfare, or the governor, including during a period when a disaster or emergency has been declared.

(2) A care facility shall not require a patient to waive the visitation rights specified in this section.

- (3) A care facility shall not impose any restriction upon visitation based on a visitor's vaccination status or require a visitor to receive a vaccination of any kind.
- (4) A care facility may, consistent with the precautions required to be taken by staff and other personnel:
  - (a) Require a visitor to submit to health screenings necessary to prevent the spread of infectious diseases;
  - (b) Restrict a visitor who does not pass a health screening requirement;
  - (c) Require a visitor to adhere to infection control procedures, including wearing personal protective equipment; and
  - (d) Limit the number of persons in a room at one time pursuant to occupancy laws and the normal visitation policy.
- (5) Each care facility shall post in a conspicuous place on the licensed premises informational materials developed by the department of health and welfare explaining the rights specified in this section.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2022.
