4	PROVIDE THAT PUBLIC UTILITY CUSTOMERS SHALL BE GIVEN AN OPPORTUNITY
5	TO OPT OUT OF RECEIVING SMART METERS, TO PROVIDE THAT A PUBLIC UTILITY
6	SHALL REPLACE A SMART METER WITH A TRADITIONAL METER AT THE REQUEST OF A
7	CUSTOMER, AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION MAY ES-
8	TABLISH A CERTAIN SURCHARGE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING
9	AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 2, Title 61, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 61-216, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 61-216. SMART METERS -- OPT-OUT POLICY. (1) For purposes of this section:
 - (a) "Smart meter" means an electronic device that records consumption of a commodity and automatically transmits consumption data to a public utility for monitoring and billing.
 - (b) "Traditional meter" means a device that records consumption of a commodity but is not capable of automatically transmitting consumption data to a public utility and is intended to be read by an individual through a visual display.
- (2) Prior to furnishing a smart meter to a customer, a public utility shall provide the customer an opportunity to opt out of receiving the smart meter. The public utility shall provide a method for customers to opt out electronically or, upon request, shall provide a paper opt-out form to the customer.
- (3) At the request of a customer, a public utility shall replace a smart meter with a traditional meter to measure the customer's consumption.
- (4) The commission may establish a surcharge for customers who opt out of receiving a smart meter or who request that a smart meter be replaced with a traditional meter. The surcharge may include a onetime fee and a monthly fee reflective of the actual costs incurred by a public utility to install, read, maintain, or service the meters of customers who opt out or request a replacement.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2022.
