10	AND WELFARE, TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION OF VISITATION POLICIES AND
11	PROCEDURES ON CERTAIN WEBSITES, TO PROVIDE FOR SUBMISSION OF CERTAIN
12	COMPLAINTS, TO PROVIDE FOR A CERTAIN HOTLINE, AND TO PROVIDE AUTHORITY
13	TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND
14	PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Title 39, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW CHAPTER, to be known and designated as Chapter 8, Title 39, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

CHAPTER 8 PATIENT RIGHT TO VISITATION

39-801. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Assistance" means aid in meeting daily living needs.
- (2) "Department" means the department of health and welfare.
- (3) "Facility" means an institution providing health care services, a health care setting, or a setting in which to receive assistance, including but not limited to hospitals and other licensed inpatient centers, ambulatory surgical or treatment centers, nursing facilities, skilled nursing centers, residential treatment centers, rehabilitation and other therapeutic health settings, certified family homes, group homes, or assisted living facilities.
- (4) "Health care agent" means a person appointed pursuant to a durable power of attorney for health care to make health care decisions for another person should the latter person become incapacitated.
- (5) "Health care services" means services for the diagnosis, prevention, treatment, cure, or relief of a health condition, illness, injury, or disease.
- (6) "Immediate family member" means a person's parent, spouse, child, or sibling.
- (7) "Patient" means a person receiving health care services at a facility.
 - (8) "Resident" means a person receiving assistance at a facility.

39-802. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. In enacting this chapter, it is the intent of the legislature to guarantee the right of Idahoans to be visited by immediate family members and health care agents when staying in a health care or assistance facility.

39-803. VISITATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES. (1) No later than thirty (30) days after the effective date of this chapter, each facility already operating in the state shall establish visitation policies and procedures. The policies and procedures must, at a minimum, include:

- (a) Infection control and education policies for visitors;
- (b) Screening, personal protective equipment, and other infection control protocols for visitors, provided that such protocols may not differ for visitors based on a visitor's vaccination or immunization status:
- (c) Limitations on the number of visitors who may be allowed to see a patient or resident at the same time, provided that no policy may limit such number to fewer than four (4) visitors; and
- (d) Designation of a person responsible for ensuring that facility staff adhere to the policies and procedures.
- (2) Safety-related visitation policies and procedures may not be more stringent than those established for facility staff and may not require visitors to submit proof of any vaccination or immunization.
- (3) Visitation policies and procedures must allow consensual physical contact between a patient or resident and the patient's or resident's visitor.
- (4) Any facility that begins operation in the state subsequent to the effective date of this chapter shall establish visitation policies and procedures prior to accepting patients or residents. Such policies and procedures must conform to the provisions of this chapter.
- 39-804. RIGHT TO VISITATION. (1) Patients or residents shall be granted the right to visitation by immediate family members and health care agents. A facility must allow in-person visitation by such persons for at least two (2) hours daily in addition to any other general visitation authorized by the facility.
- (2) The right conferred by this section is in addition to any rights conferred by chapter 98, title 39, Idaho Code.
- 39-805. REQUIREMENTS FOR VISITATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES. Visitation policies and procedures required by this chapter must allow in-person visitation in all of the following circumstances, unless the patient or resident objects:
 - (1) End-of-life situations;

- (2) During childbirth, including labor and delivery;
- (3) If the patient or resident is under the age of eighteen (18) years;
- (4) If the patient or resident lived with family prior to being admitted to the facility and is struggling with the change in environment and lack of in-person family support;
- (5) If the patient or resident is making at least one (1) major medical decision;

- (6) If the patient or resident is experiencing emotional distress or grieving the loss of a friend or family member who has recently died;
- (7) If the patient or resident needs encouragement to eat or drink, which encouragement was previously provided by a family member or caregiver; or
- (8) If the patient or resident exhibits a significant change in behavior, such as sudden avoidance of social interaction.
- 39-806. SUSPENSION OF VISITATION. (1) A facility may require a visitor to agree in writing to follow the facility's policies and procedures. A facility may suspend in-person visitation by a specific visitor if such visitor violates the facility's policies and procedures.
- (2) Visitation by immediate family members or health care agents may not be suspended based on the declaration of a state of emergency by the federal or state government or by the political subdivision in which the facility is located.
- 39-807. SUBMISSION TO THE DEPARTMENT. (1) Within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this chapter, a facility shall submit its visitation policies and procedures to the department. The department shall designate a person or persons to receive such submissions.
- (2) Subsequent to the initial submission pursuant to subsection (1) of this section, a facility shall provide its visitation policies and procedures to the department:
 - (a) When applying for licensure or license renewal;
 - (b) If ownership of the facility changes; or
 - (c) Upon request of the department.

- 39-808. ACCESS TO POLICIES ON WEBSITE -- COMPLAINTS -- HOTLINE. (1) A facility shall publish its visitation policies and procedures on its website and shall make access to such policies and procedures easily accessible from the home page of the facility's website.
- (2) Facilities already in operation as of the effective date of this chapter shall publish visitation policies and procedures within seventy-two (72) hours of their adoption. Facilities that begin operating after the effective date of this chapter shall publish their visitation policies and procedures prior to accepting patients or residents.
- (3) The department shall dedicate a standalone page on its website to explain the visitation requirements of this chapter and to provide a form for submission of complaints regarding a facility's lack of compliance with this chapter. The department shall also establish a hotline to handle complaints about a facility's lack of compliance with this chapter during an urgent or emergency situation. Such hotline shall be accessible twenty-four (24) hours per day, including on weekends and holidays.
- 39-809. AUTHORITY OF DEPARTMENT. (1) The department is authorized to take such actions as are necessary to implement the provisions of this chapter, including the promulgation of any necessary rules.
- (2) The department shall establish by rule a process for addressing and resolving complaints made pursuant to section 39-808(3), Idaho Code, in-

cluding complaints made during urgent or emergency situations that require an expeditious response and resolution.

- (3) The department may prescribe by rule administrative penalties for facilities that fail to conform to the provisions of this chapter.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2023.
