Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Title 39, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW CHAPTER</u>, to be known and designated as Chapter 97, Title 39, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

## CHAPTER 97 SUICIDE AND MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS ACCESS

- 39-9701. DECLARATION OF POLICY AND INTENT. (1) Idaho's rate of suicide is consistently higher than the national average and is consistently one of the top ten (10) causes of death in Idaho. Suicide and suicide attempts have a devastating emotional and economic impact on individuals, families, and communities across Idaho. As much as ninety percent (90%) of individuals who attempt to or die by suicide were living with a diagnosable behavioral health condition at the time of their attempt or death, although these conditions often go undiagnosed or untreated. Connecting individuals with mental health services and resources is a vital component in suicide prevention. By offering immediate help through suicide prevention hotlines and post-call crisis and behavioral health services, lives can be saved.
- (2) The national suicide hotline designation act of 2020, P.L. 116-172, established 988 as a national three (3) digit universal telephone number for a national suicide prevention and mental health crisis hotline and allows for each state to impose and collect a fee for providing 988-related services. Moneys from the fee will be held in a designated fund to be spent only in support of 988 services.
  - 39-9702. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:
- (1) "988 administrator" means the administrator of the 988 suicide prevention and mental health crisis hotline.
- (2) "988 suicide prevention and mental health crisis hotline" means the national suicide prevention lifeline or its successor maintained by the assistant secretary for mental health and substance use under section 520E-3 of the public health service act.

(3) "Community mental health centers and certified community behavioral health centers" means:

- (a) Community behavioral health organizations as licensed and certified by relevant state agencies; or
- (b) Behavioral health community crisis centers as defined in section 39-9103, Idaho Code.
- (4) "Crisis receiving and stabilization services" means facilities providing care for less than twenty-four (24) hours with capacity for diagnosis, initial management, observation, crisis stabilization, and follow-up referral services to all persons in a homelike environment.
- (5) "Mobile response teams" means teams of behavioral health professionals and peers that provide professional on-site community-based intervention, such as de-escalation and stabilization, for individuals who are experiencing a behavioral health crisis.
- (6) "National suicide prevention lifeline" or "NSPL" means a national network of local crisis centers providing free and confidential emotional support to people in suicidal crisis or emotional distress. Membership as an NSPL center requires nationally recognized certification, which includes evidence-based training for all staff and volunteers in the management of calls.
- (7) "Peers" means individuals employed on the basis of their personal lived experience of mental illness or addiction and recovery who meet the state's peer certification requirements where applicable.
- (8) "Veterans crisis line" or "VCL" means the crisis line maintained by the secretary of veterans affairs under  $38\ U.S.C.\ 1720F(h)$ .
- 39-9703. RECOGNIZED STATE CRISIS CARE AND SUICIDE HOTLINES. (1) The state of Idaho recognizes each crisis care and suicide hotline that has an active agreement with the national suicide prevention lifeline. Each recognized hotline center shall to the extent possible provide or coordinate crisis intervention services and crisis care coordination to individuals accessing the 988 suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis hotline from any jurisdiction within Idaho twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. Each hotline center shall satisfy the following criteria:
  - (a) Have an active agreement with the administrator of the national suicide prevention lifeline for participation within the network;
  - (b) Meet NSPL requirements and best practices guidelines for operational and clinical standards;
  - (c) Provide data, report, and participate in evaluations and related quality improvement activities as required by the 988 system administrator; and
  - (d) Utilize technology, including chat and text, that is interoperable among and across crisis and emergency response systems used throughout the state, such as 911, emergency medical services, other nonbehavioral health crisis services, and others as necessary, and with the administrator of the NSPL.
- (2) Each designated hotline center shall have the authority to coordinate, designate, or deploy crisis and outgoing services, including mobile crisis teams, and shall coordinate access to crisis receiving and stabilization services or other local resources as appropriate and according to

guidelines and best practices established by the NSPL. Each designated center shall actively collaborate with local community mental health centers, certified community behavioral health clinics, and community behavioral health centers to coordinate linkages for persons contacting 988 with ongoing care needs, establishing formal agreements where appropriate.

- (3) Each designated hotline center shall form a partnership with the Idaho department of health and welfare to ensure the coordination with and access to crisis receiving and stabilization services for individuals accessing the 988 suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis hotline. The partnership shall include appropriate information sharing about the availability of services and operational processes.
- (4) The Idaho department of health and welfare shall provide primary oversight of suicide prevention and crisis service activities, shall ensure the essential coordination with each designated 988 hotline center, and shall work with the NSPL and VCL networks for the purposes of ensuring consistency of public messaging about 988 services.
- (5) Each designated hotline center shall meet the requirements set forth by NSPL for serving high-risk and specialized populations as identified by the federal substance abuse and mental health services administration, including training requirements and policies for transferring such callers to an appropriate specialized center or subnetworks within or external to the NSPL network.
- (6) Each designated hotline center, when permissible, shall provide follow-up services to individuals accessing the 988 suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis hotline consistent with guidance and policies established by the NSPL.
- 39-9704. MOBILE RESPONSE TEAMS. The state of Idaho, through the Idaho department of health and welfare or through agreements with other organizations, government or otherwise, shall provide on-site response services to crisis calls utilizing mobile response teams. Mobile response teams shall:
  - (1) Collaborate with local law enforcement agencies; and
- (2) Include police as co-responders in behavioral health teams only as needed to respond in high-risk situations that cannot be managed without law enforcement.
- 39-9705. SUICIDE AND MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS ACCESS FUND. (1) There is hereby established in the state treasury the suicide and mental health crisis access fund. Moneys in the fund shall be used for purposes of this chapter and shall consist of:
  - (a) Moneys remitted by Idaho counties pursuant to section 39-9706, Idaho Code;
  - (b) Grants and gifts intended for deposit in the fund;
  - (c) Interest, premiums, gains, or other earnings on the fund; and
  - (d) Moneys deposited or transferred into the fund pursuant to legislative appropriation.
- (2) The state treasurer shall invest idle moneys in the fund, and the interest earned on such investments shall be retained by the fund.

39-9706. SUICIDE AND MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS ACCESS FEE. (1) A uniform suicide and mental health crisis access fee shall be imposed on each Idaho resident who is a subscriber of commercial landline, mobile or internet protocol-enabled voice services, and interconnected voice over internet protocol service lines at a rate per month, per telephone line, by all telecommunications providers of such services, not to exceed an equal and equivalent amount set forth in section 31-4804, Idaho Code, and in compliance with the national suicide hotline designation act of 2020, P.L. 116-172.

- (2) The fee provided in subsection (1) of this section shall be imposed upon and collected from purchasers of access lines, wireless accounts, or interconnected voice over internet protocol service lines with a service address or place of primary use within the county or 911 service area on a monthly basis by all telecommunications providers of such services. The fee may be listed as a separate item on customers' monthly bills. The fee shall be imposed only in counties or 911 service areas where the voters have approved the emergency communications fee authorized in section 31-4803, Idaho Code.
- (3) The telecommunications providers shall remit such fee to the county treasurer's office from which the fees were collected consistent with the remittance of the emergency communications fee in section 31-4804, Idaho Code. In the event the telecommunications provider remits such fees based on the fee billed to the customer, a deduction shall be allowed for uncollected amounts when such amounts are treated as bad debt for financial reporting purposes.
- (4) From every remittance to the governing body made on or before the date when the remittance becomes due, the telecommunications provider required to remit shall be entitled to deduct and retain one percent (1%) of the collected amount as the cost of administration for collecting the charge. Telecommunications providers will be allowed to list the surcharge as a separate item on the telephone subscriber's bill and shall have no obligation to take any legal action to enforce the collection of any charge or be held liable for such uncollected amounts.
- (5) On a quarterly basis, the county treasurer shall deposit the remitted funds collected for each month of the assessed fee to the office of the state treasurer to be deposited in the suicide and mental health crisis access fund established in section 39-9705, Idaho Code.
- (6) The fee established by this section may be adjusted as needed to provide for continuous operation, volume increases, and maintenance, but shall not exceed the amount assessed for the 911 emergency communication fee pursuant to section 31-4804, Idaho Code. An annual evaluation of the assessed fee amount shall be conducted by the administrator of each crisis care and suicide hotline allowed for in section 39-9703, Idaho Code, and the director, or the director's designee, of the Idaho department of health and welfare. If an adjustment to the assessed fee is necessary, the 988 administrator shall notify all telecommunications providers immediately to allow for appropriate adjustments. Telecommunications providers shall have no more than sixty (60) days to modify the assessed amount for customer billings.
- (7) If the unobligated and unencumbered cash balance in the fund established in section 39-9705, Idaho Code, exceeds one hundred million dollars

(\$100,000,000) at the close of the fiscal year, then fee collections by telecommunications providers pursuant to this section shall be suspended for future monthly collections not already remitted by the telecommunications providers. The suspension of fee remittance shall remain in effect until the cash balance is reduced to fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000) or less, at which time the 988 administrator shall immediately notify all telecommunications providers to resume collections.

39-9707. USE OF MONEYS. (1) Moneys in the suicide and mental health crisis access fund are subject to appropriation and shall be used only to offset costs that are or will be reasonably attributed to:

- (a) Primarily ensuring the efficient and effective routing of calls made to the 988 suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis hotline to each designated hotline center, including staffing and technological infrastructure enhancements necessary to achieve operational and clinical standards and best practices set forth by NSPL;
- (b) Personnel and operating costs related to specialized training to serve at-risk communities, crisis centers, or comparable service providers as defined in section 39-9702, Idaho Code, and costs related to the provision of allowable behavioral health, crisis outreach, and stabilization services for individuals needing support in response to the 988 national suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis hotline;
- (c) Onetime capital outlay purchases related to services allowable with the technological requirements provided in section 39-9703, Idaho Code:
- (d) Provision of data, reporting, and participation in evaluations and related quality improvement activities as required by the 988 administrator; and
- (e) Administration, oversight, auditing, and evaluation of the fund.
- (2) Services related to this chapter shall be funded by the fee established in section 39-9706, Idaho Code, unless comparable services are covered by the individual's health coverage.
- 39-9708. AUDITING AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. (1) All fees collected and expended pursuant to this chapter shall be audited in coordination with the auditing of the emergency communications fee established in section 31-4804, Idaho Code. The purpose of the audit is to verify the accuracy and completeness of fees collected and costs expended.
- (2) The designated hotline centers in coordination with the Idaho department of health and welfare shall provide an annual report to the senate and house of representatives health and welfare committees by January 31. The report shall include information on 988 suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis hotline usage, services referred, and services provided.
- 39-9709. FEE IMPLEMENTATION DEADLINE. Telecommunications providers shall begin the collection and remittance of the suicide and mental health crisis access fee imposed in section 39-9706, Idaho Code, no later than January 1, 2022.
