AN ACT

1 RELATING TO CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION; AMENDING CHAPTER 16, TITLE 33, IDAHO
2 CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 33-1628, IDAHO CODE, TO AUTHO-
3 RIZE PERFORMANCE-BASED INCENTIVE FUNDING FOR CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCA-
4 TION SECONDARY PROGRAMS.
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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

7 SECTION 1. That Chapter 16, Title 33, Idaho Code, be, and the same is
8 hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW SECTION, to be known and des-
9 ignated as Section 33-1628, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

10 33-1628. CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION SECONDARY PROGRAMS -- PERFOR-
11 MANCE-BASED INCENTIVE FUNDING. (1) The board for career technical education
12 shall establish and administer a performance-based incentive funding pro-
13 gram for high-quality career technical education secondary programs offered
14 in grades 9 through 12, as well as funding for those programs in need of addi-
15 tional support and technical assistance.

16 (2) Performance-based incentive funding will be available to approved
17 career technical education programs in the areas of business management and
18 marketing, engineering and technology, family and consumer sciences, health
19 professions, and skilled and technical sciences. Technical assistance
20 funding will be available to approved career technical education programs
21 in the areas of agriculture and natural resources, business management
22 and marketing, engineering and technology, family and consumer sciences,
23 health professions, and skilled and technical sciences. To be considered
24 for incentive funding, a program must first meet minimum eligibility re-
25 quirements, as set forth by the division of career technical education. All
26 approved career technical programs that meet those requirements will be
27 considered for the incentive funding.

28 (3) The division of career technical education will develop criteria
29 to evaluate each program and will award incentive funding to those programs
30 that meet or exceed the criteria established by the division. Specific cri-
31 teria will be developed for program clusters, pathways, and career special-
32 ties. The amount of each award will be at the discretion of the division
33 of career technical education and will be contingent on the availability of
34 funds.
