SENATE BILL NO. 1184

AN ACT

1 RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATION TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT  
2 PROGRAM/DIVISION OF TEACHERS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016; PROVIDING FOR EXPEN-  
3 DITURES FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM/DIVISION OF  
4 TEACHERS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016; APPROPRIATING GENERAL FUND MONEYS FOR  
5 TRANSFER TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL INCOME FUND; APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO THE  
6 PUBLIC SCHOOLS EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM/DIVISION OF TEACHERS FOR  
7 FISCAL YEAR 2016; AMENDING SECTION 33-1004E, IDAHO CODE, AS AMENDED IN  
8 SECTION 8 OF HOUSE BILL NO. 296, AS ENACTED BY THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION  
9 OF THE SIXTY-THIRD IDAHO LEGISLATURE, TO INCREASE THE BASE SALARY FOR  
10 PUPIL SERVICE STAFF AND TO INCREASE THE MINIMUM SALARY FOR PUPIL SERVICE  
11 STAFF; DIRECTING THE USE OF MONEYS FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT, TRAIN-  
12 ING AND ASSISTANCE; AND DEFINING THE TERM "DISTRIBUTED."

14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

15 SECTION 1. The following amount shall be expended for the Public  
16 Schools Educational Support Program/Division of Teachers for the period  
17 July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2016:

22 SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated the following amount to be  
23 transferred to the Public School Income Fund for the period July 1, 2015,  
24 through June 30, 2016:

1 SECTION 4. That Section 33-1004E, Idaho Code, as amended in Section 8  
2 of House Bill No. 296, as enacted by the First Regular Session of the Sixty-  
3 third Idaho Legislature, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as fol-  
4 lows:

5 33-1004E. DISTRICT'S SALARY-BASED APPORTIONMENT. Each district shall  
6 be entitled to a salary-based apportionment calculated as provided in this  
7 section.

8 (1) To determine the apportionment for instructional staff, take  
9 the amounts indicated on the career ladder table plus the amounts associ-  
10 ated with the additional education allocation amounts pursuant to section  
11 33-1004B, Idaho Code, and calculate the weighted average. The amount so  
12 determined shall be multiplied by the district staff allowance for instruc-  
13 tional staff determined as provided in section 33-1004(2), Idaho Code.  
14 Full-time instructional staff salaries shall be determined from a salary  
15 schedule developed by each district and submitted to the state department of  
16 education. No full-time instructional staff member shall be paid less than  
17 the minimum dollar amount on the career ladder residency compensation rung  
18 pursuant to section 33-1004B, Idaho Code, for the applicable fiscal year.  
19 If an instructional staff member has been certified by the national board  
20 for professional teaching standards, the staff member shall receive two  
21 thousand dollars (\$2,000) per year for five (5) years from the year in which  
22 national board certification was earned. The district staff allotment shall  
23 be increased by two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for each national board cer-  
24 tified instructional staff person and pupil service staff member who earned  
25 national board certification; provided however, that no such awards shall be  
26 paid for the period July 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011, nor shall any lia-  
27 bilities accrue or payments be made pursuant to this section in the future to  
28 any individuals who would have otherwise qualified for a payment during this  
29 stated time period. The resulting amount is the district's salary-based  
30 apportionment for instructional staff and pupil service staff. For purposes  
31 of this section, teachers qualifying for the salary increase shall be those  
32 who have been recognized as national board certified teachers as of July 1 of  
33 each year.

34 (2) To determine the apportionment for pupil service staff, first de-  
35 termine the district average experience and education index by placing all  
36 eligible district certificated pupil service employees on the statewide  
37 index pursuant to section 33-1004A, Idaho Code. The resulting average is  
38 the district index. The district pupil service staff index shall be multi-  
39 plied by the instructional base salary of ~~twenty-three~~four thousand ~~three~~  
40 ~~hundred fifty-four~~five dollars (\$~~23,354~~24,055). The amount so determined  
41 shall be multiplied by the district staff allowance for pupil service staff  
42 determined pursuant to section 33-1004(3), Idaho Code. The pupil service  
43 staff salary allocation shall be further increased by the amount necessary  
44 for each full-time equivalent pupil service staff member placed on the ex-  
45 perience and education index to be allocated at least the minimum salary  
46 mandated by this section. Full-time pupil service staff salaries shall be  
47 determined from a salary schedule developed by each district and submitted  
48 to the state department of education. The resulting amount is the district's  
49 salary-based apportionment for pupil service staff. No full-time pupil

1 service staff member shall be paid less than thirty-~~one~~two thousand seven  
2 hundred ~~fifty three~~ dollars (\$~~31,750~~32,703).

3 (3) To determine the apportionment for district administrative staff,  
4 first determine the district average experience and education index by plac-  
5 ing all eligible certificated administrative employees on the statewide  
6 index provided in section 33-1004A, Idaho Code. The resulting average is  
7 the district index. Districts with an index above the state average index  
8 shall receive their actual index but not more than the state average plus .03  
9 for the school year 1994-95, and shall receive their actual index but not  
10 more than the state average index plus .06 for the 1995-96 school year, and  
11 thereafter shall receive their actual district index. The district admin-  
12 istrative staff index shall be multiplied by the base salary of thirty-two  
13 thousand one hundred fifty-one dollars (\$32,151). The amount so determined  
14 shall be multiplied by the district staff allowance for administrative staff  
15 determined as provided in section 33-1004(4), Idaho Code. The resulting  
16 amount is the district's salary-based apportionment for administrative  
17 staff.

18 (4) To determine the apportionment for classified staff, multiply  
19 nineteen thousand two hundred forty-nine dollars (\$19,249) by the district  
20 classified staff allowance determined as provided in section 33-1004(5),  
21 Idaho Code. The amount so determined is the district's apportionment for  
22 classified staff.

23 (5) The district's salary-based apportionment shall be the sum of the  
24 apportionments calculated in subsections (1), (2), (3) and (4), of this sec-  
25 tion, plus the benefit apportionment as provided in section 33-1004F, Idaho  
26 Code.

27 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the Legislature that  
28 of the moneys appropriated in Section 3 of this act, \$10,625,000 shall be  
29 distributed for professional development, including, but not limited to,  
30 ongoing, job-embedded training, the ability for teachers to identify gifted  
31 and talented students, and to gain gifted education certification in Idaho  
32 to enable school districts to meet the requirements of Section 33-2003,  
33 Idaho Code. Funding shall be distributed by a formula prescribed by the  
34 Superintendent of Public Instruction.

35 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the Legislature for  
36 the purposes of this act, the term "distributed" means moneys that are trans-  
37 ferred to school districts and public charter schools, with no funds with-  
38 held for any other contract or administrative costs.
