## SENATE BILL NO. 1186

## BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

AN ACT 1 RELATING TO ELECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 34-102, IDAHO CODE, AS AMENDED IN 2 SECTION 1 OF HOUSE BILL NO. 138, IF ENACTED BY THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION 3 OF THE SIXTY-SEVENTH IDAHO LEGISLATURE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING 4 5 THE DEFINITION OF A PRIMARY ELECTION; AMENDING SECTION 34-606, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING ELECTION OF PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS 6 AND NOMINATION FOR PRESIDENT; AMENDING SECTION 34-703, IDAHO CODE, 7 TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING NOMINATIONS AT PRIMARY; AMENDING SEC-8 TION 34-1214, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE PROVISIONS REGARDING CERTIFICATES 9 10 OF NOMINATION OR ELECTION TO FEDERAL, STATE, DISTRICT OR NONPARTISAN OFFICES AFTER PRIMARY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EF-11 FECTIVE DATE. 12

13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Section 34-102, Idaho Code, as amended in Section 1 of House Bill No. 138, if enacted by the First Regular Session of the Sixty-seventh Idaho Legislature, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

34-102. "PRIMARY ELECTION" DEFINED -- PURPOSES. "Primary election" means an election held for the purpose of nominating persons as candidates of political parties for election to offices, and for the purpose of electing persons as members of the controlling committees of political parties, and for the purpose of allowing voters to express their choice of candidate for nomination by a political party for president of the United States. Primary elections shall be held on the third Tuesday of May in each even-numbered year.

SECTION 2. That Section 34-606, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 34-606. ELECTION OF PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS AND NOMINATION FOR PRESIDENT. (1) At the general election, 1972, and every four (4) years thereafter, there shall be elected such a number of electors of president and vice president of the United States as the state may be entitled to in the electoral college.
- (2) No person shall be elected to this position unless he has attained the age of twenty-one (21) years at the time of the election, is a citizen of the United States and shall have resided within the state two (2) years next preceding his election.
- (3) Such electors  $\underline{\text{Electors}}$  shall be certified to the secretary of state as provided  $\underline{\text{for by law}}$  in sections 34-711 and 34-711A, Idaho Code.
- (4) For the primary election, any candidate for a political party participating in the nomination for president of the United States shall file a

declaration of candidacy with the secretary of state and pay a filing fee of two thousand dollars (\$2,000), by the last Friday in January preceding the primary election. Such filing fee shall be deposited in the general fund.

(5) Participation in a primary for president of the United States by a political party shall be optional, and nothing in this title shall be construed to mandate a party's participation in a presidential primary. Any party that intends to participate in the nomination of president shall notify the secretary of state's office no later than the last Tuesday in November prior to the primary.

SECTION 3. That Section 34-703, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 34-703. NOMINATION AT PRIMARY. (1) All political party candidates for president of the United States, for United States senator and representative in congress, and all political party candidates for elective state, district, and county offices, except candidates for judicial office, at general elections shall be nominated at the primary elections, or shall have their names placed on the general election ballot as provided by law, and shall comply with the provisions of this act.
- (2) All candidates for judicial office shall be nominated or elected at the primary election, as provided by section 34-1217, Idaho Code.
  - (3) Independent candidates shall not be voted on at primary elections.

SECTION 4. That Section 34-1214, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 34-1214. CERTIFICATES OF NOMINATION OR ELECTION TO FEDERAL, STATE, DISTRICT OR NONPARTISAN OFFICES AFTER PRIMARY. (1) Immediately after the primary election canvass, the secretary of state shall issue certificates of nomination to the political party candidates of each party who receive the highest number of votes for their particular federal, state, or district office. The candidates so certified shall have their names placed on the general election ballot.
- (2) Immediately after the primary election canvass, the secretary of state shall certify to the state chair of each political party the number of votes received by that party's candidates for president of the United States. A winner shall be declared as prescribed by rule of the state and national party.
- (2) (3) Immediately after the primary election canvass, the secretary of state shall issue certificates of nomination to the nonpartisan candidate or candidates who receive the highest number of votes for the number of vacancies which are to be filled for a particular office and also to the same number of candidates who receive the second highest number of votes for the particular office. The candidates so certified shall have their names placed on the general election ballot. If it appears from the canvass that a particular candidate has received a majority of the total vote cast for the particular office, he shall be issued a certificate of election instead of a certificate of nomination and no candidates shall run for the particular office in the general election.

SECTION 5. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2023.
