AN ACT

RELATING TO RULES OF THE ROAD; AMENDING CHAPTER 6, TITLE 49, IDAHO CODE, 2 BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 49-638A, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT 3 NO DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE OR PASSENGER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL 4 THREATEN, SOUND A HORN, SHOUT OR OTHERWISE DIRECT SOUND TOWARD ANY 5 PEDESTRIAN OR PERSON OPERATING A BICYCLE OR HUMAN-POWERED VEHICLE UPON 6 A ROADWAY OR THROW AN OBJECT AT OR IN THE DIRECTION OF ANY SUCH PERSON, 7 OR ENGAGE IN CONDUCT THAT CREATES A RISK OF DEATH OR SERIOUS PHYSICAL 8 INJURY TO SUCH PERSON, TO PROVIDE FOR A MISDEMEANOR, AND TO PROVIDE FOR A 9 CIVIL PENALTY. 10

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 6, Title 49, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 49-638A, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

49-638A. THREATENING OR HARASSMENT OF PEDESTRIAN OR OPERATOR OF A
BICYCLE OR HUMAN-POWERED VEHICLE -- PENALTY. No driver of a motor vehicle or
passenger of a motor vehicle shall maliciously and with the specific intent
to intimidate or harass:

19 (1) Threaten any pedestrian or person operating a bicycle or20 human-powered vehicle upon a roadway; or

(2) Sound a horn, shout or otherwise direct sound toward any pedestrian
 or person operating a bicycle or human-powered vehicle; or

(3) Throw an object at or in the direction of any pedestrian or person
 operating a bicycle or human-powered vehicle; or

(4) Engage in conduct that creates a risk of death or serious physical
 injury to a pedestrian or a person operating a bicycle or human-powered
 vehicle.

(5) A violation of any provision of this section shall be a misdemeanor.
In addition to any penalty imposed pursuant to this section, the court shall
impose a civil penalty of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00). Any such civil
penalty imposed shall be remitted and deposited in a manner consistent with
the provisions of section 49-726, Idaho Code.
