1 RELATING TO BASIC DAYCARE LICENSING; AMENDING SECTION 39-1101, IDAHO
2 CODE, TO REVISE POLICY; AMENDING SECTION 39-1102, IDAHO CODE, TO
3 REVISE DEFINITIONS; AMENDING SECTION 39-1103, IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE
4 TERMINOLOGY AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTAIN DAYCARE LICENSES
5 BY THE DEPARTMENT UPON COMPLIANCE WITH MINIMUM STANDARDS; AMENDING
6 SECTION 39-1104, IDAHO CODE, TO APPLY CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS TO OWNERS
7 OF DAYCARE FACILITIES, TO PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE
8 DISCRETION TO CHARGE A DAYCARE OWNER OR OPERATOR FOR A REINSPECTION
9 UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES AND TO REVISE TERMINOLOGY; AMENDING
10 SECTION 39-1105, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE A LIST OF INFORMATION SOURCES
11 TO BE INCLUDED IN A CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECK, TO REQUIRE
12 COMPLIANCE WITH AN IDAHO CODE PROVISION AND TO CLARIFY LANGUAGE;
13 AMENDING SECTION 39-1106, IDAHO CODE, TO CLARIFY LANGUAGE, TO REVISE
14 WHO IS REQUIRED TO UNDERGO A LIMITED CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECK,
15 TO REMOVE AN INFORMATION SOURCE TO BE INCLUDED IN CONDUCTING A LIMITED
16 CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECK, TO PROVIDE FOR THE JURISDICTION
17 IN WHICH A CHECK OF JUVENILE RECORDS IS TO BE CONDUCTED AND TO PROVIDE
18 FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A PROVISIONAL LICENSE; AMENDING SECTION 39-1107,
19 IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE LANGUAGE REGARDING CERTIFICATION OF A DAYCARE
20 FACILITY, TO CLARIFY FROM WHOM FEES ARE TO BE COLLECTED, TO REVISE
21 LEGISLATIVE INTENT REGARDING FUNDING OF DAYCARE FACILITY LICENSING
22 ADMINISTRATION AND TO CLARIFY LANGUAGE; AMENDING SECTION 39-1108,
23 IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE TERMINOLOGY AND TO CLARIFY LANGUAGE; AMENDING
24 SECTION 39-1109, IDAHO CODE, TO REQUIRE DAYCARE OWNERS AND OPERATORS TO
25 COMPLY WITH CERTAIN SAFETY STANDARDS, TO REQUIRE CERTAIN SUPERVISION
26 BY CERTAIN STAFF MEMBERS, TO REVISE THE CHILD TO STAFF RATIOS, THE
27 DETERMINATION OF SUCH RATIOS AND THE MAXIMUM GROUP SIZE, TO REVISE
28 THE MAXIMUM RATIO OF CHILDREN TO STAFF IN MIXED AGE GROUPS AND THE
29 DETERMINATION OF SUCH RATIOS, TO PROVIDE CHILD TO STAFF RATIOS FOR
30 DAYCARE CENTERS WITH SEPARATE ROOMS FOR CHILDREN OF DEFINED AGE GROUPS
31 AND TO PROVIDE REQUIREMENTS FOR CHILD TO STAFF RATIOS AND MAXIMUM
32 GROUP SIZE FOR DAYCARE CENTERS THAT COMBINE CLASSROOMS WITH MIXED AGE
33 CHILDREN; AMENDING SECTION 39-1110, IDAHO CODE, TO REQUIRE DAYCARE
34 OWNERS AND OPERATORS TO COMPLY WITH CERTAIN HEALTH STANDARDS AND TO
35 REVISE TERMINOLOGY; AMENDING SECTION 39-1111, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE
36 RULEMAKING AUTHORITY TO SPECIFY OFFENSES AFFECTING ELIGIBILITY FOR
37 DAYCARE LICENSURE AND TO CLARIFY LANGUAGE; AMENDING SECTION 39-1113,
38 IDAHO CODE, TO REVISE FROM WHOM CHAPTER COMPLIANCE IS REQUIRED, TO
39 REMOVE A LISTING OF OFFENSES DISQUALIFYING A PERSON FROM ELIGIBILITY

 3 IDAHO CODE, TO CLARIFY TO WHOM A GRACE PERIOD MAY BE APPLIED AND TO WHOM
 4 CRIMINAL PENALTIES SHALL BE APPLIED AND TO CLARIFY LANGUAGE; AMENDING
 5 SECTION 39-1117, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE REFERENCE TO A CERTIFICATE,
 6 TO APPLY DISCLAIMER LANGUAGE TO DAYCARE OWNERS AND OPERATORS AND TO
 7 CLARIFY LANGUAGE; AMENDING SECTION 39-1118, IDAHO CODE, TO APPLY
 8 CERTAIN IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS TO AN OWNER OF A DAYCARE FACILITY, TO
 9 CLARIFY THE AUTHORITY TO PROMULGATE RULES REGARDING DAYCARE OWNERS AND
 10 OPERATORS AND TO CLARIFY LANGUAGE; AND AMENDING SECTION 39-1119, IDAHO
 11 CODE, TO REQUIRE THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A DAYCARE FACILITY TO COMPLY
 12 WITH CERTAIN TRAINING REQUIREMENTS AND TO REVISE TERMINOLOGY.

13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

14 SECTION 1. That Section 39-1101, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
 15 amended to read as follows:

16 39-1101. POLICY. It is hereby declared to be the policy of this state
 17 to establish a minimum statewide system for the protection of children in
 18 daycare ~~facilities~~. This system is intended to establish minimum standards,
 19 while still leaving primary responsibility for evaluation and selection of
 20 daycare services with parents. The minimum standards established by this
 21 chapter shall not be construed as preempting more stringent regulation by
 22 county or city ordinance.

23 SECTION 2. That Section 39-1102, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
 24 amended to read as follows:

25 39-1102. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

26 (1) "Attendance" means the number of children present at a daycare
 27 facility.

28 (2) "Board" means the Idaho board of health and welfare.

29 (23) "Child" means a person less than thirteen (13) years of age.

30 (4) "Child:Staff ratio" means the maximum number of children allowed
 31 under the direct care and supervision of one (1) staff person.

32 (35) "Daycare" means care and supervision provided for compensation
 33 during part of a twenty-four (24) hour day, for a child or children not
 34 related by blood, marriage, adoption or legal guardianship to the person or
 35 persons providing the care, in a place other than the child's or children's
 36 own home or homes.

37 (46) "Daycare center" means a ~~place or~~ facility providing daycare
 38 for compensation for where thirteen (13) or more children, regardless
 39 of relationship to the daycare owner, daycare operator or staff, are in
 40 attendance.

41 (57) "Daycare facility" means a ~~place or~~ daycare center, group daycare
 42 facility providing or family daycare services for compensation to seven (7)
 43 or more children not related to the provider home.

44 (8) "Daycare operator" means a person at least eighteen (18) years of
 45 age who is delegated the responsibility for the daily management of a daycare
 46 facility by the daycare owner.

1 (9) "Daycare owner" means a person at least eighteen (18) years of age
 2 who has been issued a basic daycare license to operate a daycare facility.

3 ~~(610) "Department" means the Idaho department of health and welfare.~~

4 (11) "Direct care and supervision" means staff is within sight and
 5 normal hearing range of the child or children being supervised.

6 ~~(7) "Employee" means any person working for compensation in a facility~~
 7 ~~that provides daycare.~~

8 ~~(812) "Family daycare home" means a home, place, or facility providing~~
 9 ~~daycare for where six (6) or fewer children, regardless of relationship to~~
 10 ~~the daycare owner, daycare operator or staff, are in attendance.~~

11 ~~(913) "Group daycare facility" means a home, place, or facility~~
 12 ~~providing daycare for where seven (7) to twelve (12) children, regardless~~
 13 ~~of relationship to the daycare owner, daycare operator or staff, are in~~
 14 ~~attendance.~~

15 ~~(10) "Group size" means the maximum number of children in one (1) group~~
 16 ~~or classroom.~~

17 ~~(144) "Mixed age group" means a care group that includes of children of~~
 18 ~~multiple ages.~~

19 ~~(12) "Ratio" means the number of staff required to supervise a certain~~
 20 ~~number of children.~~

21 ~~(13) "Single age group" means a care group that includes children of~~
 22 ~~similar age.~~

23 (15) "Second degree of relationship" means persons related by
 24 consanguinity, that is, relatives by blood, or by affinity, that is,
 25 relatives by marriage, guardianship or adoption, and includes their
 26 spouses. The number of degrees between two (2) relatives is calculated by
 27 summing the number of ties between each relative and the common ancestor.

28 (16) "Staff" means any person working for compensation in a daycare
 29 facility.

30 (147) "Training" means continuing education in child development
 31 areas relating to ~~child~~ daycare. Training can be acquired through a
 32 variety of methods including, but not limited to, the viewing of audio
 33 visual materials, correspondence courses, community workshops and in-house
 34 training.

35 SECTION 3. That Section 39-1103, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
 36 amended to read as follows:

37 39-1103. LICENSING AUTHORITY. (1) The department is hereby authorized
 38 and directed to issue "basic daycare licenses" as provided in this chapter.
 39 The department is authorized to establish procedures for issuing licenses
 40 to daycare owners for facilities which shall be maintained and operated in
 41 conformity with the standards authorized in this chapter. Nothing in this
 42 chapter shall be construed to limit or restrict the teaching of religious
 43 doctrines, values, or tenets in a facility licensed under the provisions of
 44 this chapter. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to:

45 (1a) The occasional care of a neighbor's, relative's or friend's child
 46 or children by a person not ordinarily in the business of providing
 47 daycare;

1 ~~(2b)~~ The operation of a private school or religious school for
2 educational purposes for children over four (4) years of age or a
3 religious kindergarten;

4 ~~(3c)~~ The provision of occasional care exclusively for children of
5 parents who are simultaneously in the same building;

6 ~~(4d)~~ The operation of day camps, programs and religious schools for
7 less than twelve (12) weeks during a calendar year or not more often than
8 once a week; or

9 ~~(5e)~~ The provision of care for children of a family within the second
10 degree of relationship.

11 (2) Upon a finding by the department of compliance with the minimum
12 standards set forth in this chapter, the department may issue any of the
13 following types of basic daycare licenses to a daycare owner:

14 (a) A daycare center license is issued to a daycare owner who provides
15 daycare in a facility where thirteen (13) or more children are in
16 attendance.

17 (b) A group daycare facility license is issued to a daycare owner who
18 provides daycare in a facility where seven (7) to twelve (12) children
19 are in attendance.

20 (c) A family daycare home license is issued to a daycare owner who
21 provides daycare in a facility where six (6) or fewer children are in
22 attendance.

23 SECTION 4. That Section 39-1104, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
24 amended to read as follows:

25 39-1104. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE -- FIRE SAFETY AND HEALTH
26 INSPECTIONS. (1) Application. A person who wishes to own or operate a
27 daycare facility shall be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age, shall
28 submit an application on the forms provided by the department, and shall
29 obtain the required certificates of inspection as provided herein.

30 (2) Inspections. A person who wishes to own or operate a daycare
31 facility shall submit: (a) a certificate of a fire inspection of the
32 proposed ~~center~~ daycare facility, conducted by a fire department or fire
33 district official, establishing compliance with the minimum standards
34 specified in section 39-1109, Idaho Code; and (b) a health and safety
35 inspection of the proposed daycare facility conducted by a qualified
36 inspector as designated by the department, establishing compliance with the
37 minimum standards specified in sections 39-1109 and 39-1110, Idaho Code.

38 (3) Continued compliance and reinspection. Daycare facilities owners
39 and operators shall at all times maintain compliance with the safety and
40 health requirements identified in this chapter. The department may cause
41 any daycare facility to be reinspected during the term of a license for
42 safety and health compliance as determined necessary by the department. ~~No~~
43 The department may charge the daycare owner or operator for any reinspection
44 after the initial inspection in any license period shall be made to if the
45 daycare facility owner or operator repeatedly fails or refuses to comply
46 with safety standards or corrective action plans.

47 SECTION 5. That Section 39-1105, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
48 amended to read as follows:

1 39-1105. CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECKS. (1) The department shall
 2 obtain from the owner a criminal history background check on the owners,
 3 operators and ~~employees~~ staff of a daycare facility who have direct contact
 4 with children, and on all other individuals thirteen (13) years of age or
 5 older who have unsupervised direct contact with children or are regularly on
 6 the premises of a daycare facility. The criminal history background check
 7 shall ~~include the following~~ comply with section 56-1004A, Idaho Code, for
 8 all persons subject to the provisions of this section who are eighteen (18)
 9 years of age or older+;

- 10 ~~(a) Statewide criminal identification bureau;~~
 11 ~~(b) Federal bureau of investigation (FBI) criminal history;~~
 12 ~~(c) National crime information center; and~~
 13 ~~(d) Statewide child abuse registry.~~

14 (2) Criminal history background checks on those persons under eighteen
 15 (18) years of age shall include a check of the juvenile justice records
 16 of adjudications of the magistrate division of the district court, county
 17 probation services and department records as authorized by the minor and his
 18 parent or guardian.

19 (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 39-1103, Idaho Code,
 20 ~~which that~~ provide for exemption from the provisions of this chapter, any
 21 person who owns, operates or is employed by a private school for educational
 22 purposes for children four (4) through six (6) years of age or a private
 23 kindergarten shall comply with the provisions of this section.

24 SECTION 6. That Section 39-1106, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
 25 amended to read as follows:

26 39-1106. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE -- BASIC, PROVISIONAL AND RENEWAL. (1)
 27 Upon receipt of the application, inspection certificates and the results of
 28 the criminal history background check, the department shall, upon a finding
 29 of compliance with the minimum standards set forth in this chapter, issue a
 30 basic daycare license to the ~~applicant~~ owner of the daycare facility. The
 31 license shall be valid for two (2) years and shall be posted in a conspicuous
 32 place at the daycare facility.

33 (2) The department shall send a renewal application to the owner of the
 34 daycare facility no later than ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of
 35 an existing license. The owner shall submit to the department the renewal
 36 application with the required renewal fee and ~~a~~ the results of the criminal
 37 history background check prior to the expiration of the existing license.
 38 A complete criminal history background check shall be provided for any
 39 new persons requiring a criminal history background check in accordance
 40 with section 39-1105, Idaho Code. A limited criminal history background
 41 check shall be provided for those persons eighteen (18) years of age or
 42 older who ~~where~~ previously ~~checked~~ completed and cleared a criminal history
 43 background check in accordance with section 56-1004A, Idaho Code, within the
 44 previous twelve (12) months. The limited criminal history background check
 45 shall include:

- 46 (a) Statewide criminal identification bureau; and
 47 (b) ~~National crime information center; and~~
 48 ~~(c) Statewide child abuse registry.~~

1 (3) Criminal history background checks on those persons under eighteen
2 (18) years of age shall include a check of the juvenile justice records
3 of adjudications of the magistrate division of the district court, county
4 probation services and department records as authorized by the minor and his
5 parent or guardian for the jurisdiction within which the minor resides.

6 (4) The department shall maintain a list of all licensees for public
7 use.

8 (5) Submission of a renewal application, fee and required criminal
9 history background check shall entitle the daycare facility owner to
10 continue daycare services, subject to action by the department pursuant to
11 section 39-1113, Idaho Code.

12 (6) Upon initial investigation, should an applicant for a license be
13 unable to meet a standard because of conditions that are unlikely to endure
14 beyond four (4) months from the date of such investigation, the department
15 may, if in its judgment the health and safety of any child is not thereby
16 endangered, issue a provisional license for a period not to exceed four (4)
17 months. No more than two (2) provisional licenses shall be issued to the same
18 daycare facility owner or operator in any twelve (12) month period.

19 SECTION 7. That Section 39-1107, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
20 amended to read as follows:

21 39-1107. FEES. (1) The department shall establish by rule the maximum
22 total fee to be assessed for a basic daycare license which shall not exceed
23 one hundred seventy-five dollars (\$175) for daycare centers and one hundred
24 dollars (\$100) for group daycare facilities. Criminal history background
25 check fees shall be in addition, but at actual cost. No other fees shall be
26 charged for each license period. The department may allocate the fees to
27 daycare licensing administration costs as it deems appropriate.

28 (2) The department is authorized to utilize Idaho child care program
29 funds as otherwise allowed by law to pay for the costs associated with
30 ~~certification and daycare licensing of daycare facilities~~ to the extent
31 that fees collected from ~~the facilities daycare owners~~ do not fully cover
32 such costs. It is the intent of the legislature that licensing fees and
33 ~~Idaho child care program department~~ funds shall fully fund daycare ~~facility~~
34 licensing administration.

35 SECTION 8. That Section 39-1108, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
36 amended to read as follows:

37 39-1108. LOCAL OPTION. If a city or county, within its respective
38 jurisdiction, has adopted an ordinance for regulation and/or licensing
39 of daycare ~~services~~, then the provisions of this chapter shall not apply
40 with such city or county unless the ordinance is subsequently repealed. To
41 qualify for exemption, regulation of ~~centers~~ daycare must include a criminal
42 history background check at least as stringent as the check required in
43 section 39-1105, Idaho Code, compliance with safety standards at least as
44 stringent as required in section 39-1109, Idaho Code, compliance with health
45 standards at least as stringent as required in section 39-1110, Idaho Code,
46 compliance with immunization requirements at least as stringent as required
47 in section 39-1118, Idaho Code, and compliance with training requirements

1 at least as stringent as required in section 39-1119, Idaho Code. Cities
2 and counties are hereby granted authority and may adopt ordinances for
3 regulation and/or licensing of daycare ~~services~~.

4 SECTION 9. That Section 39-1109, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
5 amended to read as follows:

6 39-1109. SAFETY STANDARDS. (1) Daycare ~~facilities~~ owners and
7 operators shall comply with the following safety standards in the area of the
8 daycare facility in which daycare is provided:

- 9 (a) Adequate fire and smoke alarms;
- 10 (b) A functional telephone located on the daycare premises during the
11 hours of operation;
- 12 (c) Adequate fire extinguishers;
- 13 (d) Adequate exits;
- 14 (e) Firearms or other weapons which are stored on the premises of a
15 daycare facility must be kept in a locked container that is inaccessible
16 to children while daycare attendees are present;
- 17 (f) Pools, hot tubs, ponds and other bodies of water that are on the
18 daycare facility premises must provide the following safeguards:
- 19 (i) The area surrounding the body of water must be fenced and
20 locked in a manner that prevents access by children and meets the
21 following requirements:
- 22 1. The fence must be at least four (4) feet high with no
23 vertical opening more than four (4) inches wide, be designed
24 so that a young child cannot climb or squeeze under or
25 through the fence, surround all sides of the pool and have
26 a gate that is self-closing and that has a self-latching
27 mechanism in proper working order out of the reach of young
28 children;
- 29 2. If the house forms one (1) side of the barrier for the
30 pool, all doors that provide unrestricted access to the pool
31 must have alarms that produce an audible sound when the door
32 is opened;
- 33 3. Furniture or other large objects must not be left near the
34 fence in a manner that would enable a child to climb on the
35 furniture or other large object and gain access to the pool;
36 and
- 37 (ii) If the area surrounding a pool, hot tub, pond or other body of
38 water is not fenced and locked, there must be a secured protective
39 covering that will not allow access by a child;
- 40 (iii) Wading pools must be empty when not in use;
- 41 (iv) Children must be under direct supervision of ~~an adult~~ staff
42 member while using a pool, hot tub, pond or other body of water; and
- 43 (v) A minimum of a four (4) foot high fence must be present that
44 prevents access from the daycare facility premises if the daycare
45 premises are adjacent to a body of water; and
- 46 (g) The owner or operator of a daycare facility shall ensure that at all
47 times children are present, at least one (1) ~~adult~~ staff member on the
48 premises has current certification in pediatric rescue breathing and
49 first-aid treatment from a certified instructor.

(2) No fire standards developed pursuant to this chapter shall be more stringent than the standards contained in the International Fire Code, as adopted by Idaho.

(3) ~~An adult~~ staff member at least eighteen (18) years of age must be present at all times during business hours on the daycare facility premises.

(4) In addition to the safety standards identified in subsection (1) of this section, safety standards shall be established by the department to govern the maximum allowable ratio of children to staff subject to the following restrictions:

~~(a) In no event shall the child staff ratio require more than one (1) staff member to six (6) children for all children age twenty four (24) months or less; more than one (1) staff member to eight (8) children for all children above age twenty four (24) months but less than three (3) years; more than one (1) staff member to ten (10) children for all children age three (3) years but less than four (4) years; more than one (1) staff member to twelve (12) children for all children age four (4) years but less than five (5) years; and more than one (1) staff member to eighteen (18) children for all children whose age is five (5) years or more. The maximum group size for all groups shall not exceed twice the number of children allowed for a single staff member.~~

~~(b) The maximum ratio of children to staff in mixed age groups shall be determined by the age of the youngest child in attendance.~~

~~(c) All adults~~ Each adult staff member on duty who is providing direct care and supervision to the children shall will be counted as staff by the department for purposes of computing a determining compliance with child-staff ratio. ~~Employees~~ Staff sixteen (16) and seventeen (17) years of age who are under the direct supervision of an adult employee staff member, when on duty and providing direct care and supervision to children, may will be counted by the department as staff for the purposes of computing the determining compliance with child-staff ratio.

~~(d)~~ Each child shall in attendance will be counted by the department as one (1) child for purposes of computing a determining compliance with child-staff ratio.

1 ~~(e) Daycare facilities shall have a maximum allowable child staff~~
2 ~~ratio based on the age of the children in attendance. The maximum group~~
3 ~~size is twelve (12) children. If more than two (2) children are in~~
4 ~~attendance under the age of two (2) years, the maximum group size shall~~
5 ~~be ten (10) children. If three (3) or more children under the age of two~~
6 ~~(2) years are in attendance, the maximum group size shall be nine (9)~~
7 ~~children.~~
