AN ACT

1 APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE FOR THE DI-
2 VISIONS OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES, PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITALIZATION, AND
3 SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT AND PREVENTION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013; LIMIT-
4 ING THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS; PROVIDING
5 FOR GENERAL FUND TRANSFERS TO THE COOPERATIVE WELFARE FUND; DIRECTING
6 EXPENDITURES FOR TRUSTEE AND BENEFIT PAYMENTS; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE
7 INTENT FOR PROGRAM INTEGRITY; DIRECTING AN INTERAGENCY PAYMENT FOR
8 JUVENILE DETENTION CLINICIANS CONTRACT; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE INTENT
9 FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT AND PREVENTION FOR THE STATEWIDE MEDIA
10 CAMPAIGN ON UNDERAGE DRINKING; PROVIDING FOR COURT SERVICES FUND TRANS-
11 FERS; DIRECTING AN INTERAGENCY REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR A NEW SUB-
12 STANCE ABUSE TREATMENT AND PREVENTION NETWORK MANAGEMENT AND SERVICE
13 COORDINATION CONTRACT; AND PROVIDING GUIDANCE FOR EMPLOYEE COMPENSA-
14 TION AND BENEFITS.

16 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

17 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Health and
18 Welfare, the following amounts to be expended according to the designated
19 programs and expense classes, from the listed funds for the period July 1,
20 2012, through June 30, 2013:

25 SECTION 2. FTP AUTHORIZATION. In accordance with Section 67-3519,
 26 Idaho Code, each of the divisions in the Department of Health and Welfare
 27 listed below is authorized no more than the number of full-time equivalent
 28 positions listed below at any point during the period July 1, 2012, through
 29 June 30, 2013, unless specifically authorized by the Governor. The Joint
 30 Finance-Appropriations Committee will be notified promptly of any increased
 31 positions so authorized.

35 SECTION 3. GENERAL FUND TRANSFERS. As appropriated, the State Con-
 36 troller shall make transfers from the General Fund to the Cooperative

1 Welfare Fund, periodically, as requested by the director of the Department
2 of Health and Welfare and approved by the Board of Examiners.

3 SECTION 4. TRUSTEE AND BENEFIT PAYMENTS. Notwithstanding the provi-
4 sions of Section 67-3511, Idaho Code, funds budgeted in the trustee and
5 benefit payments expenditure class shall not be transferred to any other
6 expense classes during fiscal year 2013.

7 SECTION 5. PROGRAM INTEGRITY. Notwithstanding any other provisions of
8 law, it is hereby declared to be the intent of the Legislature that the De-
9 partment of Health and Welfare shall be required to provide those services
10 authorized or mandated by law in each program, only to the extent of funding
11 and available resources appropriated for each budgeted program.

12 SECTION 6. INTERAGENCY PAYMENT FOR JUVENILE DETENTION CLINICIANS CON-
13 TRACT. The Children's Mental Health Program shall, no later than July 16,
14 2012, make an interagency payment of \$327,000 from the Cooperative Welfare
15 (General) Fund to the Department of Juvenile Corrections to be used for the
16 purchase of contract clinician services with juvenile detention facilities
17 in Idaho, for the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013.

18 SECTION 7. STATEWIDE MEDIA CAMPAIGN ON UNDERAGE DRINKING. It is the
19 intent of the Legislature that, for fiscal year 2013, the Substance Abuse
20 Treatment and Prevention Division shall continue to fund at least \$50,000 of
21 the \$1,600,000 prevention budget for the youth and adult media campaign on
22 underage drinking.

23 SECTION 8. COURT SERVICES FUND TRANSFERS. As appropriated, the State
24 Controller shall make transfers of the Court Services Fund to the Coopera-
25 tive Welfare Fund periodically, as requested by the director of the Depart-
26 ment of Health and Welfare and approved by the Board of Examiners.

27 SECTION 9. SUBSTANCE ABUSE NETWORK MANAGEMENT AND SERVICE COORDINATION
28 CONTRACT. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Health
29 and Welfare, and all state agencies that provide substance abuse services,
30 issue a joint request for proposals for contract services to provide ad-
31 ministrative support to the coordinated statewide substance abuse system,
32 manage the statewide provider network, coordinate client services, manage
33 and report data per applicable federal and state requirements, track fiscal
34 data for the program, and provide other necessary services as identified by
35 the department and partnering state agencies. The department and partnering
36 state agencies shall issue the request for proposals in time to execute a new
37 contract for such services by June 30, 2013.

38 SECTION 10. EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS. The Legislature rec-
39 ognizes and thanks all state workers for their dedication, professionalism
40 and for the personal sacrifices they make every day in the performance of
41 their duties to serve our citizens. In accordance with the provisions of
42 Section 67-5309C, Idaho Code, the Legislature supports the Governor's rec-
43 ommendation in not making changes in annual salaries and benefits for state

1 employees based upon labor markets or specific occupational inequities; di-
2 rects agencies and institutions that have excess personnel cost appropria-
3 tions or salary savings due to turnover to use such funding for a merit in-
4 crease component, notwithstanding the provisions of Section 67-5309B(4),
5 Idaho Code, to recognize and reward permanent and temporary state employees;
6 and does provide funding to agencies and institutions to provide a two per-
7 cent (2%) pay increase for all classified and nonclassified permanent per-
8 forming employees. Performing employees shall be all permanent employees,
9 including adjunct faculty at colleges and universities, who have been rated
10 as "achieves" or better on a performance plan if required by Division of Hu-
11 man Resources rule, including probationary permanent employees making sat-
12 isfactory progress. The Legislature supports the Governor's recommendation
13 to fund increases in the cost of health insurance benefits and directs the
14 director of the Department of Administration, as the administrator of the
15 state insurance plan, to maintain the current benefit package to the extent
16 possible, which may require a cost sharing on the part of employees for the
17 increased cost of the health insurance plan.
