## SENATE PROCLAMATION NO. 101

## A PROCLAMATION

COMMENDING PEACE CORPS VOLUNTEERS FROM THE STATE OF IDAHO AS WELL AS ALL VOL-UNTEERS ACROSS THE NATION.

We, the members of the Senate of the State of Idaho assembled in the First Regular Session of the Sixty-first Idaho Legislature, do hereby proclaim:

WHEREAS, on March 1, 1961, President John F. Kennedy signed an executive order establishing the Peace Corps and in the fall of 1961, the inaugural group of volunteers departed to serve in Ghana and Tanzania. Since 1961, more than 170,000 Americans have joined the Peace Corps, ranging in age from 18 to 86; and

WHEREAS, March 2, 2011, marks the 50th anniversary of the Peace Corps. Today, the Peace Corps Act mandate remains the same as it was 50 years ago, to "promote world peace and friendship" through three goals of helping the people of interested countries and areas in meeting their needs for trained men and women, helping promote a better understanding of Americans on the part of the peoples served, and helping promote a better understanding of other peoples on the part of Americans; and

WHEREAS, the Peace Corps actively recruits volunteers with a variety of backgrounds and experiences to best share our nation's greatest resource – its people – with the communities where volunteers serve around the globe. Volunteers serve in the areas of education, youth and community development, health, business and information and communication technology, agriculture, environment, HIV/AIDS and food security and have made significant and lasting contributions in those areas, improving the lives of individuals and communities where they serve; and

WHEREAS, the Peace Corps has become an enduring symbol of our nation's commitment to encourage progress, create opportunity, and expand development at the grass roots level in the developing world; and

WHEREAS, Peace Corps volunteers, enriched by their experiences overseas, have also brought their communities throughout the United States a deeper understanding of other cultures and traditions, thereby bringing a domestic dividend to our nation; and

WHEREAS, since its inception, there have been 1,347 Peace Corps volunteers from the state of Idaho with many volunteers coming from the various colleges and universities including the University of Idaho, North Idaho College, Lewis Clark State College, Boise State University, College of Idaho, Northwest Nazarene College, College of Southern Idaho, Idaho State University and BYU Idaho.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the members of the Senate assembled in the First Regular Session of the Sixty-first Idaho Legislature, that we congratulate and commend the Peace Corps volunteers for 50 years of service and contributions that have positively affected many lives as well as for

their inspiration for the next generation of volunteers promoting peace and friendship around the world.

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we support the agency's mission and legacy of service by honoring those who have served from the state of Idaho, as well as all those who have served from across the nation.
