Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Department of Corrections for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, as follows:

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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

ARTICLE 1

Section 1. The amount of \$1,357,863,600, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Corrections to meet its operational expenses, including tort claims, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

14 ARTICLE 2

Section 1. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as 15 16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sex Offender 17 Management Board Fund to the Sex Offender Management Board for the purposes authorized by the Sex Offender Management 18 19 Board Act including, but not limited to, sex offender 20 evaluation, treatment, and monitoring programs and grants. Funding received from private sources is to be expended in 21 22 accordance with the terms and conditions placed upon the 23 funding.

- 2 Section 1. The sum of \$668,000, or so much thereof as
- 3 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
- 4 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for a grant to the
- 5 Illinois Sentencing Policy Advisory Council.
- 6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July
- 7 1, 2015.
