1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 5

5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this
7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
8 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose
9 in Section 5 of Article 27 of Public Act 95-734, is
10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is
15 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
16 Building.

17 Section 10. The sum of \$553,641, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 27 of Public
21 Act 95-734, is reappropriated from the Capital Development

1 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
 2 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
 3 other related expenses, including architectural and
 4 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
 5 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
 6 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

7 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or
 8 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
 9 in Sections 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes
 10 and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

15 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
 16 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
 17 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
 18 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
 19 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
 20 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
 21 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

22 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

6 Section 15. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
8 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture
9 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

11 Section 20. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
13 Now Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit into
14 the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund.

19 Section 5. The amount of \$13,500,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
21 Now Fund to the Department of Central Management Services for
22 infrastructure improvement, hardware and related costs.

1 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
2 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
3 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and
4 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

5 Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development
7 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and
8 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the
9 Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS
10 750/9-11.

11 Section 10. The sum of \$75,000,000, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
13 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
14 Opportunity for all costs associated with the capital
15 development of coal gasification plants, next generation
16 ethanol production facilities, next generation bio-diesel
17 production facilities and coal-based energy systems.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs Now
20 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
21 for a grant to the Abraham Lincoln Capital Airport to realign
22 the front entrance road.

1 Section 20. The sum of \$450,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
3 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for grants, loans, and investments or other
5 economic development activities including, but not limited
6 to, community public safety programs, job creation and
7 retention programs, community support and economic
8 development.

9 Section 25. The sum of \$100,000,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
11 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for grants, loans and investments or other
13 activities associated with health care development, including
14 but not limited to the Hospital Capital Investment Program.

15 Section 30. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
17 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for affordable housing grants, loans, and
19 investments.

20 Section 35. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs

1 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator
3 Laboratory for the Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

4 Section 40. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
6 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
8 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

9 Section 45. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
11 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at
13 Urbana/Champaign for all costs associated with design and
14 construction of a Petascale Computing Facility.

15 Section 50. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs Now
17 Fund to the Department Of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
18 for a grant to the University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign
19 for the Information Trust Institute to procure and develop
20 the Center for Pervasive Health Technology.

21 Section 55. The amount of \$250,000,000 or so much

1 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
2 Illinois Jobs Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and
3 Economic Opportunity for the making of grants, loans and
4 investments or other community reinvestment activities,
5 including but not limited to planning, acquisition,
6 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
7 extension of public infrastructure.

8

9 Section 60. The amount of \$25,000,000 or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
11 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of
13 brownfield sites.

14

15 Section 65. The amount of \$25,000,000 or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Jobs
17 Now Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
19 Article 8, Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

21 Section 70. No contract shall be entered into or
22 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
23 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
24 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
25 Governor.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

5 Section 5. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 31, Section 10 of Public Act 95-734, is
9 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
11 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

12 Section 10. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore
15 made in Article 31, Section 40 of Public Act 95-734, is
16 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
18 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

19 Section 15. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore

1 made in Article 31, Section 45 of Public Act 95-734, is
2 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
3 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
4 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope
5 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
6 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
7 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these
8 purposes.

9 Section 20. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore
12 made in Article 31, Section 75 of Public Act 95-734, is
13 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
14 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
15 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
16 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
17 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
18 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
19 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
20 within the State.

21 Section 25. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much
22 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
23 close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation

1 heretofore made in Article 31, Section 80 of Public Act 95-
2 734, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
3 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
4 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
5 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
6 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
7 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
8 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
9 within the State, including but not limited to a grant for a
10 commercial scale project that produces electric power and
11 hydrogen and demonstrates underground storage of up to 1
12 million metric tons annually of carbon dioxide.

13 Section 30. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore
16 made in Article 31, Section 90 of Public Act 95-734, is
17 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
18 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
19 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
20 Crystallization Facility.

21 Section 35. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
22 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
23 close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation

1 heretofore made in Article 31, Section 95 of Public Act 95-
2 734, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
3 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
4 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

5 Section 40. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 31, Section 105 of Public Act 95-734, is
9 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
11 to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the Illinois
12 Accelerator Research Center.

13 Section 45. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
15 close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation
16 heretofore made in Article 31, Section 120 of Public Act 95-
17 734, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
18 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
20 Development Act.

21 Section 50. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
22 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the

1 close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation
2 heretofore made in Article 31, Section 125 of Public Act 95-
3 734, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
4 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.
6

7 Section 55. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore
10 made for such purpose in Article 1, Section 10 of Public Act
11 95-1030, is reappropriated from the FY09 Budget Relief Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 the Illinois Rural HealthNet.
14

15 Section 60. The amount of \$35,000,000, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
17 close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation
18 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 2, Section 20 of
19 Public Act 95-1030, is reappropriated from the Coal
20 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
21 Economic Opportunity for the purpose of facility cost reports
22 prepared pursuant to Section 1-75(d)(4) of the Illinois Power
23 Agency Act.

25 Section 65. No contract shall be entered into or

1 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
2 appropriation herein made in this Article in Sections 5
3 through 50, until after the purpose and amounts have been

GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

10 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
12 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
13 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
14 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
15 boat access areas.

16 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
18 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
19 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
20 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
21 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
22 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access

1 areas.

2 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
3 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
4 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
5 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
6 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
7 construction and development of facilities for transient,
8 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
9 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
10 Grant Program.

11 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, is
12 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
13 Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
14 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the
15 Agency's operational expenses.

16 Section 30. The following named sums, new
17 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
18 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
19 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

21 For multiple use facilities and
22 programs for boating purposes

 3 and development, all costs for supplies,
 4 materials, labor, land acquisition,

8 Payable from State Parks Fund:

9 For multiple use facilities and programs
 10 for park and trail purposes provided by
 11 the Department of Natural Resources, including
 12 construction and development, all costs
 13 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 14 acquisition, services, studies, and
 15 all other expenses required to comply with
 16 the intent of this appropriation150,000

17 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish
 19 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition
 20 and development, including grants, for the implementation of
 21 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the
 22 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically
 23 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

1 Section 40. To the extent federal funds including
 2 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 3 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 4 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the
 5 Department of Natural Resources for construction and
 6 renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational
 7 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under
 8 the Clean Vessel Act.

9 Section 50. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 10 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 11 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 12 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 13 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 14 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 15 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 16 refunds and the purposes stated:

17 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

18 For U.S. Forest Service Program500,000

19 Section 55. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
 20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and
 21 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources,
 22 Office of Mines and Minerals for the Landowner Grant Program
 23 authorized under the Oil and Gas Act, as amended by Public

1 Act 90-0260.

2 Section 60. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
4 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside
5 Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning
6 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned
7 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency
8 response.

9 Section 65. The sum of \$99,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
11 Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the
12 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the
13 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now
14 or hereafter amended.

15 Section 70. The following named sums, new
16 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
17 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
18 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

19 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:

20 For the acquisition, preservation and
21 stewardship of natural areas, including habitats
22 for endangered and threatened species, high

1 quality natural communities, wetlands
 2 and other areas with unique or unusual
 3 natural heritage qualities3,000,000

4 Section 75. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
 5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space
 6 Lands Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of
 7 Natural Resources for expenses connected with and to make
 8 grants to local governments and to distressed communities as
 9 provided in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development
 10 Act".

11 Section 80. The sum of \$495,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant
 13 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
 14 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions
 15 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter
 16 amended.

17 FOR ILLINOIS HABITAT FUND PROGRAM

18 Section 85. The sum of \$1,215,000, or so much thereof as
 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
 20 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
 21 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
 22 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment

1 Act", as now or hereafter amended.

2 Section 90. The sum of \$225,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
4 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
5 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
6 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor
7 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of
8 Sportsmen Series license plates.

9 Section 95. The sum of \$800,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
11 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water
12 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for
13 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress
14 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in
15 Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated),
16 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15
17 ILCS 515/1 Illinois Compiled Statutes.

18 Section 100. The following named sums, or so much
19 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
20 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
21 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
22 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or

1 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
2 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
3 refunds and the purposes stated:

4 Payable from Land and Water Recreation Fund:

5 For Outdoor Recreation Programs\$6,200,000

6 Section 105. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off Highway
8 Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
9 for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit
10 organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and
11 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as
12 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act,
13 including administration, enforcement, planning and
14 implementation of this Act.

15 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
17 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
18 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
19 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
20 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
21 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
22 refunds and the purposes stated:

23 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire

1 Protection Assistance Fund:
 2 For Rural Community Fire Protection
 3 Programs\$325,000

4 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as
 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
 6 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 7 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
 8 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
 9 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and
 10 areas for the use of snowmobiles.

11 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
 13 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 14 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of
 15 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the
 16 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter
 17 amended.

18 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including
 19 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum
 20 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
 21 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 22 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.

1 Section 130. The sum of \$144,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
3 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
4 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
5 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
6 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
7 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the
8 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

9 Section 135. The sum of \$144,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
11 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
12 for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl
13 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United
14 States which specifically provide waterfowl for the
15 Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as
16 amended.

17 Section 140. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
