Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

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Section 40. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may 1 2 be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the non-federal cost 3 4 share of a Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program to long-term contracts and permanent conservation 5 establish 6 easements in the Illinois River Basin; to fund cost share 7 assistance to landowners to encourage approved conservation practices in environmentally sensitive and highly erodible 8 9 areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to fund the monitoring 10 of long-term improvements of these conservation practices as 11 required in the Memorandum of Agreement between the State of Illinois and the United States Department of Agriculture. 12

13 Section 41. The sum of \$24,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish 14 15 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for (i) 16 reallocation of Wildlife and Fish grant reimbursements, (ii) 17 wildlife conservation and restoration plans and programs from 18 federal and/or state funds provided for such purposes or (iii) 19 both purposes.

6 Section 46. The sum of \$25,000, or so much thereof as may 7 be necessary, is appropriated from the Roadside Monarch Habitat 8 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for ordinary and 9 contingent expenses related to the development, enhancement and 10 restoration of Monarch butterfly and other pollinator habitat.

11 Section 47. The sum of \$294,774, or so much thereof as may 12 be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund 13 to the Department of Natural Resources for ordinary and 14 contingent expenses of Resource Conservation.

15 Section 48. The sum of \$6,700,000, or so much thereof as 16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish 17 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for expenses of 18 subgrantee payments.

Section 49. The sum of \$1,818,042, or so much thereof as may be necessary, independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or private corporation, organization, or individual, is appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources from the Federal Title IV Fire Protection Assistance Fund for refunds and for Rural Community Fire Protection Programs.
