Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1 Section 5. The sum of \$70,825,000, or so much thereof as 5 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund 7 to the Department of Central Management Services for ordinary and contingent expenses. 8 9 Section 10. 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Section 35. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Energy Transition Assistance Fund to the Department of Central Management Services for operational expenses and administration of the Energy Transition Act including state fleet electrification.
